AN ACT

Amending the act of December 16, 1998 (P.L.980, No.129), 1 entitled "An act providing for a waiver of tuition and other 2 fees for children of certain deceased police officers, 3 National Guard members, firefighters and correction employees 4 at community colleges and State-owned and State-related institutions of higher education and for additional powers 5 6 and duties of the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance 7 Agency and the Department of General Services," extending 8 benefits to certain surviving spouses; and further providing 9 for title of act, for short title, for definitions, for 10 Postsecondary Educational Gratuity Program, for report to 11 General Assembly and for retroactivity. 12

13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

14 hereby enacts as follows:

15 Section 1. The General Assembly finds and declares that it 16 is the intent of this act to recognize the ultimate sacrifice made by police officers, firefighters, correction employees, 17 18 sheriffs and deputy sheriffs and National Guard members killed 19 in the performance of their duties by providing a postsecondary 20 educational gratuity for their children or surviving spouses at 21 community colleges and State-owned or State-related institutions 22 in this Commonwealth.

1 Section 2. The title and section 1 of the act of December 2 16, 1998 (P.L.980, No.129), known as the Police Officer, 3 Firefighter, Correction Employee and National Guard Member Child Beneficiary Education Act, are amended to read: 4 5 AN ACT Providing for a waiver of tuition and other fees for children or 6 7 surviving spouses of certain deceased police officers, 8 National Guard members, firefighters [and], emergency medical 9 services personnel, correction employees, State parole 10 agents, county probation and parole officers, sheriffs and 11 deputy sheriffs at community colleges and State-owned and 12 State-related institutions of higher education and for 13 additional powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Higher 14 Education Assistance Agency and the Department of General Services. 15 16 Section 1. Short title. 17 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Police 18 Officer, Firefighter, Correction Employee [and] . National Guard 19 Member [Child] and Special Public Servant Beneficiary Education 20 Act. Section 3. Section 2 of the act is amended by adding 21 definitions to read: 22 Section 2. Definitions. 23 24 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 25 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 26 context clearly indicates otherwise: * * * 27 "County officer." A county probation or parole officer of 28 29 this Commonwealth. * * * 30

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1	"Emergency medical services personnel." The term includes,
2	but is not limited to, emergency medical services providers as
3	defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 8103 (relating to definitions).

5	"State parole agent." A parole officer appointed by the
6	Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole.
7	"Surviving spouse." A resident of this Commonwealth who is
8	the spouse of a deceased police officer, firefighter, emergency
9	medical services personnel, correction employee, State parole
10	agent, county probation and parole officer, sheriff, deputy
11	sheriff or National Guard member, at the time of death, killed
12	in the performance of his or her duties.

14	Section 4. Section 3 of the act, amended November 30, 2004
15	(P.L.1663, No.210), is amended to read:
16	Section 3. Postsecondary Educational Gratuity Program.
17	(a) EstablishmentThere is hereby established the
18	Postsecondary Educational Gratuity Program for children <u>or</u>
19	surviving spouses of police officers, firefighters, emergency
20	medical services personnel, correction employees, State parole
21	agents, county probation and parole officers, sheriffs, deputy
22	sheriffs and National Guard members and certain other
23	individuals who are on Federal or State active military duty who
24	are residents of this Commonwealth who are killed while acting
25	in the performance of their duties.
26	(b) Eligibility
27	(1) Police officers shall be deemed to have been killed
28	in the performance of their duties if death results from job-
29	related injuries sustained or inflicted while performing any

30 of the following:

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(i) Answering an emergency call.

2 (ii) Conducting interrogations of crime suspects or
3 interrogations pursuant to a response to an emergency
4 call.

5 (iii) Conducting vehicle stops for traffic6 violations.

7 (iv) Actively responding to requests for assistance
8 from the public.

9 (v) Maintaining order and security at the scene of 10 an emergency.

11 (2) Firefighters shall be deemed to have been killed in 12 the performance of their duties if death results from job-13 related injuries sustained or inflicted while performing any 14 of the following:

(i) Being present at the scene of a fire or going to
and from a fire. In the case of volunteer firefighters,
going to and from a fire shall include traveling from and
directly returning to the firefighter's home, place of
business or other location where the firefighter was when
the fire call or alarm was received for a fire which the
firefighter's volunteer fire company attended.

(ii) Answering an emergency call.

23 (iii) Maintaining order and security at the scene of24 an emergency.

(3) A member of the National Guard shall be deemed to
have been killed in the performance of his or her duties if
his or her death results from performance of a duty required
by his or her orders or commander while in an official duty
status authorized under Federal or State law.

30 (4) Correction employees shall be deemed to have been 20150SB0025PN0010 - 4 - 1 killed in the performance of their duties if death results 2 from job-related injuries sustained or inflicted while 3 maintaining order and security or otherwise carrying out 4 their duties at a correctional facility.

5 (4.1) Sheriffs and deputy sheriffs shall be deemed to 6 have been killed in the performance of their duties if death 7 results from job-related injuries sustained or inflicted 8 while maintaining order and security or otherwise carrying 9 out their duties as a sheriff or deputy sheriff.

10 (4.2) An individual who is on Federal or State active 11 military duty who is a resident of this Commonwealth shall be 12 deemed to have been killed in the performance of duty if 13 death results from performance of a duty required by his or 14 her orders or commander while in an official duty status.

15 (4.3) Emergency medical services personnel shall be
 16 deemed to have been killed in the performance of their duties
 17 if death results from job-related injuries sustained or
 18 inflicted while answering an emergency call.

19 (4.4) State parole agents and county probation and 20 parole officers shall be deemed to have been killed in the 21 performance of their duties if death results from job-related 22 injuries sustained or inflicted while carrying out their 23 duties.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section,
deaths which occur as the direct and proximate result of
preexisting physical conditions, diseases or illnesses shall
be excluded from eligibility under this section.

(6) Any child <u>or surviving spouse</u> of a police officer,
firefighter, <u>emergency medical services personnel</u>, correction
employee, <u>State parole agent</u>, <u>county probation and parole</u>

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1 <u>officer</u>, sheriff, deputy sheriff or National Guard member
2 killed in the performance of his or her duties shall be
3 eligible for an educational gratuity provided:

<u>(i) In the case of a child, that</u> the child is 25
years of age or younger at the time of application for
participation in this program, meets all admission
requirements of the community college or State-owned or
State-related institution to which application is made
and is enrolled as a full-time student at a community
college or a State-owned or State-related institution.

11 (ii) In the case of a surviving spouse, that the 12 surviving spouse meets all admission requirements of the 13 community college or State-owned or State-related 14 institution to which application is made and is enrolled 15 as a full-time student at a community college or a State-16 owned or State-related institution.

(7) A child who is 25 years of age or younger at the time of the child's application for participation in this program [and who] or a surviving spouse, either of whom meets all other eligibility requirements, may receive an educational gratuity for up to five years provided the child or surviving spouse otherwise continues to be eligible for participation.

24 (c) Scope of benefit.--

(1) The benefit available under this section shall be
provided only for full-time students who are pursuing
undergraduate studies leading to an associate degree or a
baccalaureate degree.

29 (2) A child <u>or surviving spouse</u> becomes eligible for
30 this benefit after he or she has applied for available

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1 scholarships and Federal and State grants to cover tuition 2 and room and board costs. The child <u>or surviving spouse</u> must 3 provide a record of application for such financial aid to the 4 community college or State-owned or State-related institution 5 to which he or she is applying.

A community college or a State-owned or State-6 (3) 7 related institution shall waive all remaining tuition and 8 room and board charges (total tuition, room and board and 9 fees minus awarded scholarships and Federal and State grants) for an eligible child or surviving spouse during the time the 10 child <u>or surviving spouse</u> is enrolled as a full-time student 11 12 provided the child or surviving spouse meets all requirements 13 for admission to the community college or State-owned or 14 State-related institution and during the child's or surviving 15 spouse's enrollment complies with all requirements of the institution for continued attendance and award of an 16 17 associate degree or a baccalaureate degree.

18 (d) Administration.--

(1) Copies of all police officer [and], firefighter and
emergency medical services personnel death certifications
received by the Department of General Services under the act
of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), referred to as the
Emergency and Law Enforcement Personnel Death Benefits Act,
shall be provided by the Department of General Services to
PHEAA within 20 days of their receipt.

(2) Written notification of the death of any correction
employee killed in the performance of his or her duties shall
be submitted to PHEAA by the Secretary of Corrections within
20 days of the death of the employee.

30 (2.1) Written notification of the death of any <u>county</u> 20150SB0025PN0010 - 7 - probation and parole officer, sheriff or deputy sheriff
killed in the performance of his or her duties shall be
submitted to PHEAA by the county commissioners of the county
in which the county probation and parole officer was
<u>employed</u>, sheriff was elected or deputy sheriff was employed
within 20 days of the death of the employee.

7 (2.2) Written notification of the death of any State
8 parole agent killed in the performance of his or her duties
9 shall be submitted to PHEAA by the chairman of the
10 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole within 20 days of
11 the death of the employee.

(3) Written notification of the death of any member of
the National Guard or other individual who is on Federal or
State active military duty who is a resident of this
Commonwealth killed in the performance of his or her duties
shall be submitted to PHEAA by the Adjutant General of the
Department of Military and Veterans Affairs within 20 days of
the death of the National Guard member.

19 Applications for an educational gratuity shall be (4) 20 submitted to PHEAA by the child or the surviving parent or 21 quardian of the child or the surviving spouse, together with 22 a certified copy of the child's birth certificate or adoption 23 record or other documentation of birth or adoption acceptable 24 to PHEAA or a marriage certificate. The application shall 25 include a copy of the child's or surviving spouse's letter of 26 acceptance at a community college or a State-owned or State-27 related institution. If no death certification has been 28 received from the Department of General Services, Secretary 29 of Corrections, county commissioners, chairman of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole or Adjutant 30

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General of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs,
PHEAA may elect to accept other documentation certifying that
the [child's parent] <u>decedent</u> was a police officer,
firefighter, <u>emergency medical services personnel</u>, correction
employee, <u>State parole agent</u>, <u>county probation and parole</u>
officer, <u>sheriff</u>, <u>deputy sheriff</u> or National Guard member
killed during the performance of his or her duties.

8 (5)Within 30 days of receipt of a completed 9 application, PHEAA shall send written notice to the child or 10 surviving spouse and the community college or State-owned or State-related institution of the child's or surviving 11 12 spouse's eligibility or noneligibility for participation in 13 this program. If the child or surviving spouse is determined 14 not to be eligible for an educational gratuity, the notice 15 shall include the reason or reasons for such determination and an indication that an appeal of PHEAA's determination may 16 17 be made pursuant to 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law 18 and procedure).

19 Upon receipt of notification of the child's or (6) 20 surviving spouse's eligibility from PHEAA, a community 21 college or a State-owned or State-related institution is 22 prohibited from charging the child or the child's parent or 23 guardian or surviving spouse any tuition fee or room and 24 board charge. If moneys have been received by the community 25 college or the State-owned or State-related institution for 26 these purposes, those moneys must be refunded in full within 27 30 days of receipt by the community college or the Stateowned or State-related institution of the notice of the 28 29 child's or surviving spouse's eligibility.

30 (7) Each community college or State-owned or State-

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related institution at which an eligible child <u>or surviving</u>
spouse is enrolled shall notify PHEAA upon the child's <u>or</u>
surviving spouse's graduation or when the child <u>or surviving</u>
spouse is no longer enrolled at the community college or
State-owned or State-related institution.

6 Section 5. Sections 4 and 8 of the act are amended to read:7 Section 4. Report to General Assembly.

8 Each year as part of its budget presentation to the General9 Assembly, PHEAA shall provide a report on:

10 (1) The number of applications submitted during the 11 prior year, including numbers of applications approved and 12 disapproved.

13 (2) The number of children <u>or surviving spouses</u>
14 currently participating in this program at community colleges
15 or State-owned or State-related institutions.

16 (3) The number of program participants who have
17 completed requirements for an associate degree or a
18 baccalaureate degree during the prior year.

19 (4) The total number of program participants who have
20 received an associate degree or a baccalaureate degree since
21 the program's inception.

(5) The number of program participants who were approved
for an educational gratuity but who never obtained an
associate degree or a baccalaureate degree.

25 Section 8. Retroactivity.

26 This act shall be retroactive to:

27 <u>(1)</u> January 1, 1976, and the benefit provided shall be 28 available to qualified children of police officers,

29 firefighters, correction employees and National Guard members 30 of this Commonwealth killed in the performance of their

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1	duties since that date. No community college, State-owned or
2	State-related institution shall reimburse qualified children
3	for tuition and fees or room and board charges paid between
4	January 1, 1976, and the effective date of this act.
5	(2) January 1, 2015, and the benefit provided shall be
6	available to qualified surviving spouses of police officers,
7	firefighters, emergency medical services personnel,
8	correction employees, State parole agents, county probation
9	and parole officers, sheriffs and deputy sheriffs and
10	National Guard members of this Commonwealth killed in the
11	performance of their duties since that date. No community
12	college, State-owned or State-related institution shall
13	reimburse qualified surviving spouses for tuition and fees or
14	room and board charges paid between January 1, 2015, and the
15	effective date of this paragraph.
16	Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
