## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as 1 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 2 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 4 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and 17 brewed beverages, further providing for shipment of wine into 18 19 Commonwealth. 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

21 hereby enacts as follows:

22 Section 1. Section 488 of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90,

23 No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended June 29,

24 1987 (P.L.32, No.14) and added February 21, 2002 (P.L.103,

25 No.10), is amended to read:

26 Section 488. Shipment of Wine [into Commonwealth].--(a) The

shipment of wine [from out-of-State] to residents of this
 Commonwealth [is prohibited, except as otherwise provided for
 in] shall be governed by this section.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this act or law 4 (b) to the contrary, a person licensed by the board or another state 5 6 as a producer[, supplier, importer, wholesaler, distributor or retailer] of wine and who obtains a direct wine shipper license 7 8 as provided for in this section may ship up to [nine] eighteen liters per month of any wine [not included on the list provided 9 for in subsection (c)] on the Internet, telephone or mail order 10 of any resident of this Commonwealth who is at least twenty-one 11 12 (21) years of age for such resident's personal use and not for resale. 13

(c) Each month, the board shall publish on the Internet a list of all classes, varieties and brands of wine available for sale in the Pennsylvania Liquor Stores. [A person holding a direct shipper license may ship only those classes, varieties and brands of wine not included on the list at the time an Internet order is placed.]

20 (c.1) Prior to issuing a direct wine shipper license, the
21 board shall require the person seeking the license to:

22 (1) File an application with the board.

23 (2) Pay a one hundred dollar (\$100) registration fee.

24 (3) Provide to the board a true copy of its current

25 alcoholic beverage license issued by the board or another state,

26 <u>if applicable.</u>

27 (4) Provide the board with any other information the board
28 deems necessary and appropriate.

29 (5) Provide documentation which evidences that it has

30 obtained a sales tax license from the Department of Revenue.

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1 (d) [An out-of-State] <u>A direct</u> wine shipper shall:

2 (1) Not ship more than [nine] <u>eighteen</u> liters per month on
3 the Internet, telephone or mail order of any person in this
4 Commonwealth.

5 (2) Report to the board each year the total of wine shipped 6 [into] to residents of this Commonwealth in the preceding 7 calendar year.

8 (3) Permit the board or the Secretary of Revenue, or their 9 designated representatives, to perform an audit of the [out-of-10 State] <u>direct</u> wine shipper's records upon request.

11 (4) Be deemed to have submitted to the jurisdiction of the 12 board, any other State agency and the courts of this 13 Commonwealth for purposes of enforcement of this section and any 14 related laws, rules or regulations.

15 (5) Require proof of age of the recipient in a manner or 16 format approved by the board before any wine is shipped to a 17 resident of this Commonwealth.

18 (6) Ensure that all boxes or exterior containers of wine

19 shipped directly to a resident in this Commonwealth are

20 conspicuously labeled with the words "CONTAINS ALCOHOL:

21 SIGNATURE OF PERSON 21 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER REQUIRED FOR

22 <u>DELIVERY."</u>

23 (7) Pay to the Department of Revenue all taxes due on sales
24 to residents of this Commonwealth. The amount of such taxes

25 shall be calculated as if the sales were in this Commonwealth at

26 the locations where delivery is made.

27 (8) Annually renew its license by paying a renewal fee
28 established by the board.

(e) A direct shipper may ship wine on the Internet <u>or mail</u>
order of a resident into this Commonwealth provided that the

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wine [is shipped to a Pennsylvania Liquor Store selected by the 1 2 resident. The wine will be subject to taxes in the same manner 3 as wine sold directly by the board. The wine will not be released by the State store until all moneys due, including all 4 taxes and fees, have been paid by the resident.] will be subject\_ 5 to all taxes due on sales to residents of this Commonwealth with 6 7 the amount of such taxes to be calculated as if the sale were in 8 this Commonwealth at the location where delivery is made.

9 (f) [A person shall sign an affidavit provided by the 10 Pennsylvania Liquor Store where the wine was delivered to 11 stating that the wine will only be used for the person's 12 personal use.] Any person who resells wine obtained under this

section commits a misdemeanor of the second degree.

(g) The board may promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary to implement and enforce the provisions of this section. [The board may charge the resident a fee to cover the cost associated with processing the Internet order.]

18 (h) The board shall submit [monthly] <u>annual</u> reports to the Appropriations Committee and the Law and Justice Committee of 19 20 the Senate and to the Appropriations Committee and the Liquor 21 Control Committee of the House of Representatives summarizing the number of direct shipper licenses issued by the board[,] and 22 the quantity of wine sold by direct wine shippers pursuant to 23 24 this section [and the total dollar value of sales under this 25 section].

(i) The term "wine" as used in this section shall mean
liquor which is fermented from grapes and other fruits, having
alcoholic content of twenty-four per centum or less. The term
"wine" shall not include malt or brewed beverages nor shall wine
include any products containing alcohol derived from malt,

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- 1 grain, cereal, molasses or cactus.
- 2 (j) The term "direct wine shipper" as used in this section\_
- 3 shall mean a wine producer who holds a direct wine shipper
- 4 license as provided in this section and includes a limited
- 5 <u>winery.</u>
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
