AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in inspection of vehicles, further providing for 2 requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles and for 3 prohibition on expenditures for emission inspection program; and requiring the Department of Transportation to notify the 5 United States Environmental Protection Agency of 6 modifications to the vehicle emission program. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 4702(f) and (q) of Title 75 of the 10 11 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section 12 is amended by adding a subsection to read: 13 § 4702. Requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles. 14 Emission inspection. -- Subject vehicles operated in this 15 16 Commonwealth [must be emission] shall be: 17 (1) Emission inspected as provided in section 4706 18 (relating to prohibition on expenditures for emission 19 inspection program). 20 (2) Subject to biennial testing, unless exempted from

- 1 the requirements for emission inspection.
- 2 (g) Exceptions.—The following are exceptions to subsection 3 (f):
- Emission inspection criteria for [registration of] 4 (1)5 newer subject vehicles [with new registration plates] .-- A 6 subject vehicle [never before registered in this Commonwealth or any other jurisdiction having less than 5,000 miles on its 7 odometer and for which an annual or temporary registration 8 9 plate was originally issued within the past 12 months shall be exempt from emission inspection for one year from the date 10 11 of original registration.] shall be exempt from emission 12 inspection until five years after the model year. A certificate of exemption shall be affixed to the subject 13 14 vehicle in a manner prescribed by department regulations. The expiration date of the exemption shall be determined when the 15 certificate of exemption is issued based upon the month the 16 17 registration expires and five years after the model year. No subject vehicle shall be exempt for a period of greater than 18 19 60 months under this paragraph.
 - (2) Emission inspection criteria for [new vehicles with transferred registration plates.—A subject vehicle never before registered in this Commonwealth or any other jurisdiction having less than 5,000 miles on its odometer and bearing a registration plate which has been transferred from another vehicle shall be required to pass an emission inspection prior to the next registration renewal, but not within nine months of the date of purchase of the subject vehicle.] previously exempted vehicles.—A certificate of exemption previously issued under paragraph (1) shall remain valid for the period originally issued regardless of the

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transfer of ownership of the vehicle.

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- 2 [(3) Emission inspection criteria for used subject 3 vehicles with new or transferred registration plates .-- A subject vehicle sold having a title issued in this or any 4 5 other jurisdiction or sold with a manufacturer's statement of 6 origin and having 5,000 or more miles on its odometer and 7 which displays a currently valid certification of emission 8 inspection shall be required to be emission inspected prior 9 to expiration of the certificate of emission unless the 10 renewal of registration becomes due immediately before the 11 expiration of the certificate of emission inspection, in 12 which case the subject vehicle shall be emission inspected prior to expiration of the new or transferred registration 13 14 plate. If there is no evidence of emission inspection, an 15 emission inspection must precede the next registration 16 renewal.
- 17 Emission inspection criteria for vehicles operated 18 with miscellaneous motor vehicle business registration plates 19 or dealer registration plate. -- A subject vehicle which 20 displays a miscellaneous motor vehicle business registration 21 plate or a dealer registration plate shall be exempt from the 22 requirements for emission inspection until [it has accumulated 5,000 miles on its odometer. At that time it 23 24 shall be subject to the provisions of subsection (f).] five years after the model year. A certificate of exemption shall 25 26 be affixed to the subject vehicle in a manner prescribed by department regulations. The expiration date of the 27 28 certificate of exemption shall be determined when the certificate of exemption is issued based upon the month of 29 the manufacture of the vehicle as designated by the 30

- 4 (5) For purposes of this subsection, "model year" shall
- 5 <u>mean the calendar year so designated by the manufacturer of a</u>
- 6 vehicle as the model year.
- 7 (h) Antitampering inspections. -- No vehicle shall be required
- 8 to undergo antitampering inspections for emissions control
- 9 components.
- 10 Section 2. Section 4706 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
- 11 subsection to read:
- 12 § 4706. Prohibition on expenditures for emission inspection
- program.

- 15 (c.2) Certificate of exemption. -- A fee of no more than \$2
- 16 plus the fee paid to access the department's computer system may
- 17 <u>be charged for a certificate of exemption issued under section</u>
- 18 4702(g) (relating to requirement for periodic inspection of
- 19 vehicles) or replacement of a certificate of exemption.

- 21 Section 3. The Department of Transportation, in consultation
- 22 with the Department of Environmental Protection, shall
- 23 immediately notify the Environmental Protection Agency of the
- 24 following:
- 25 (1) The modifications to the vehicle emission program
- under 75 Pa.C.S. \$\$ 4702(f), (g) and (h) and 4706(c.2).
- 27 (2) The Department of Transportation's intent to seek
- the Environmental Protection Agency's approval of the plan in
- 29 accordance with the requirements of Federal law.
- 30 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
