12	Section 110. Legal AdvertisingWhenever, under the
13	provisions of this act, notice is required to be published in
14	one newspaper, such publication shall be made in a newspaper of
15	general circulation, as defined [by the Newspaper Advertising
16	Act, approved May sixteenth, one thousand nine hundred and
17	twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand seven hundred eighty-
18	four), printed in the township, if there is such a newspaper,
19	and, if not, then in a newspaper circulating generally in such

1 township] in 45 Pa.C.S. § 101 (relating to definitions) which is\_ circulated in the township affected. If such notice is required 2 3 to be published in more than one newspaper, it shall be published in at least one newspaper of general circulation, 4 defined [as aforesaid, printed, if there be such a newspaper, or 5 6 circulating generally as above provided in the township] in 45 Pa.C.S. § 101 which is circulated in the township affected. When 7 8 such notice relates to any proceeding or matter in any court, or the holding of an election for the increase of indebtedness, or 9 10 the issue and sale of bonds to be paid by taxation, such notice shall also, in counties of the second, third, fourth and fifth 11 12 classes, be published in the legal newspaper, if any, designated 13 by the rules of court of the proper county for the publication 14 of legal notices and advertisements, unless such publication be dispensed with by special order of court: Provided, however, 15 That ordinances, auditors' statements, summaries of auditors' 16 17 statements, advertisements inviting proposals for public 18 contracts and for bids for materials and supplies, or lists of 19 delinquent taxpayers, shall be published only in newspapers of 20 general circulation, defined as aforesaid.

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
