## AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
Statutes, in messenger service, further providing for
authorization of messenger and agent services, for agent
duties and responsibilities and for transaction of business
with department; and providing for fees, for agent training
and for audits.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:

- 9 Section 1. Section 7501(a) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 10 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 11 § 7501. Authorization of messenger and agent services.
- 12 (a) General rule. -- The department shall enter into contracts
- 13 for messenger and agent services. Contracts shall include a
- 14 statement that noncompliance with any contract requirement shall
- 15 be subject to department-imposed sanctions.

- 17 Section 2. Section 7504.1 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
- 18 subsection to read:
- 19 § 7504.1. Agent duties and responsibilities.
- 20 \* \* \*

- 1 (e) Fees.--Each messenger or agent service that maintains a
- 2 <u>publicly accessible Internet website shall post current fee</u>
- 3 <u>information for each service offered under its contract.</u>
- 4 Section 3. Section 7505 of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 5 § 7505. Transaction of business with department.
- 6 (a) Department designation. -- The department may designate
- 7 those locations, facilities and hours of operation at which
- 8 messenger or agent services may transact business with the
- 9 department. Every messenger or agent service with whom a
- 10 contract has been signed pursuant to this chapter shall be
- 11 permitted to transact business with the department at the
- 12 locations and facilities and during the hours of operation
- 13 designated by the department.
- 14 (b) Listing. -- The department shall maintain a comprehensive
- 15 <u>listing of all messenger or agent services under subsection (a)</u>,
- 16 which includes the messenger or agent service's name and
- 17 business location, the services offered under the agent
- 18 service's contract and the corresponding fee schedule. The
- 19 <u>information shall be made available on the department's</u>
- 20 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 21 (c) Regulations. -- The department may prescribe such
- 22 regulations as may be necessary for the administration of this
- 23 chapter.
- 24 Section 4. Title 75 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 25 § 7507.1. Fees.
- The department shall establish the maximum fee allowable for
- 27 <u>each service that a messenger or agent service may offer.</u>
- 28 § 7510. Agent training.
- 29 (a) Contract provision. -- A contract between the department
- 30 and a card agent or full agent shall include provisions that:

- 1 (1) a card agent or full agent must obtain basic agent
- 2 training before the agent provides services under the
- 3 <u>contract; and</u>
- 4 (2) services under the contract may only be provided if
- 5 <u>an individual who has received basic agent training is</u>
- 6 <u>present.</u>
- 7 (b) Training required. -- Employees of card agents or full
- 8 agents must obtain basic agent training within 120 days of
- 9 <u>hiring. Card agents, full agents and employees of card or full</u>
- 10 agents must complete training biannually.
- 11 (c) Sanction. -- The department shall prohibit a card agent,
- 12 full agent, and any employee of a card agent or full agent, from
- 13 performing agent services if the agent or employee of the agent
- 14 does not obtain the required training. The sanction shall remain
- 15 in effect until documentation of completion of the training is
- 16 received by the department.
- 17 (d) Database. -- The department shall establish a database
- 18 containing information on agent training for the purpose of
- 19 monitoring agents' compliance with training requirements.
- 20 <u>§ 7511</u>. Audits.
- 21 (a) General rule. -- The department shall establish an audit
- 22 procedure to monitor compliance with this chapter. The audit
- 23 procedure shall include, at a minimum, the requirements set
- 24 forth under this section.
- 25 (b) Auditor training. -- The department shall:
- 26 (1) Develop a standard curriculum for auditors. The
- 27 <u>training shall be provided on an ongoing basis and shall</u>
- 28 include basic and advanced instruction and cover the
- 29 <u>following topics:</u>
- 30 (i) Fraud.

- 1 (ii) Responsibilities of an agent under the agent's
- 2 <u>contract with the department.</u>
- 3 (2) Monitor auditor training to ensure each auditor is
- 4 <u>receiving the required training.</u>
- 5 (c) Procedures generally. -- Audit procedures shall be
- 6 standardized and published in a comprehensive audit manual. The
- 7 manual shall include specific steps for necessary follow-up when
- 8 <u>deficiencies are identified</u>.
- 9 (d) Online messenger services. -- Online messenger service
- 10 audit procedures shall include specific steps for follow-up on
- 11 <u>audit deficiencies and provide guidance on necessary</u>
- 12 <u>documentation of any follow-up. Procedures shall ensure that</u>
- 13 <u>each online messenger service has an ongoing training plan in</u>
- 14 place and that each online messenger service employee has
- 15 completed initial and ongoing training.
- 16 (e) Number of audits. -- The department shall increase efforts
- 17 to conduct a greater number of audits each year to meet its
- 18 stated goals and to ensure that every contracted agent is
- 19 audited within a four-year period.
- 20 (f) Documentation. -- The department shall ensure that:
- 21 (1) Auditors document all audit steps performed, the
- 22 results of each step and any follow-up of audit deficiencies.
- 23 (2) Audit lists of items checked are complete and
- 24 accurate.
- 25 (g) Department practices. -- The department shall implement
- 26 <u>the following practices:</u>
- 27 <u>(1) Auditors shall be permitted to travel overnight as</u>
- warranted.
- 29 (2) Auditors' work schedules shall be adjusted to allow
- audits to be conducted after 5 p.m., as needed.

- 1 (3) All card agents and full agents must be included in
- 2 the population from which the department selects agents to
- 3 <u>audit.</u>
- 4 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
