## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 1 Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight 18 19 Fund, the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted 20 Receipt Account and the Justice Reinvestment Fund to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the 21 22 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 23 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 24 for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for the 25 proper operation of several departments of the Commonwealth 26 and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor 27 License Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of 28 29 Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth 30 and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015; and to provide for the additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the 31 32 33 General Fund and the State Lottery Fund for the Executive

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- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 9 PART I
- 10 GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 11 Section 101. Short title.
- 12 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 13 Appropriation Act of 2015.
- 14 SECTION 101.1. INTENT.
- 15 IT IS THE INTENT OF THIS GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT TO PROVIDE
- 16 INTERIM FUNDING FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2015, TO JUNE 30,
- 17 2016, TO MINIMIZE DISRUPTIONS TO SERVICES AND PROGRAMS IN THIS
- 18 COMMONWEALTH.
- 19 Section 102. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 21 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 22 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 24 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 25 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
- 26 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
- 27 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 28 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 29 other assistants in any department, board or commission.
- 30 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding

- 1 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 2 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and

- 4 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
- 5 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
- 6 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
- 7 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
- 8 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
- 9 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 10 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
- 11 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 12 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 13 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 14 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 15 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 16 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 17 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
- 18 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
- 19 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
- 20 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
- 21 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
- 22 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
- 23 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
- 24 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution
- 25 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
- 26 medical assistance program.

- 3 agency of the Commonwealth shall be paid into the General

- 15 The Governor may transfer any excess money in those funds
- 16 receiving proceeds of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general
- 17 obligation bonds in excess of the amount necessary for the

- 19 sinking fund for payment of debt service due on outstanding

- 18 The Minority Leader of the Senate and the Minority Leader of the
- 19 House of Representatives shall be informed by the respective
- 20 presiding officers of transfers under this section.
- 21 Section 2110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment
- 22 Commission.
- The appropriation made in this act or in any other fiscal
- 24 year to the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining
- 25 unexpended and unencumbered on the effective date of this
- 26 section may, upon the written concurrence of the President pro

- 9 symbols approved by the Office of the Budget and paid after June

- 14 Section 2201. Retroactivity.
- This act shall be retroactive to July 1, 2015.
- 16 Section 2202. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect immediately.
