### AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the <--1 Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 3 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for certain 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills-6 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal yearending June 30, 2015; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The-10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home-11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check-14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act-17 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight 18 19 Fund, the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted Receipt Account and the Justice Reinvestment Fund to the 20 Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the 21 22 <del>Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial</del> 23 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 24 for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for the 25 proper operation of several departments of the Commonwealth 26 27 and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of 28 29 Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth 30 and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015; and to provide for the 31 additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the 32 General Fund and the State Lottery Fund for the Executive 33 Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 34

- 23 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 24 Appropriation Act of 2015.
- 25 Section 102. Definitions.

- 11 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
- 12 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
- 13 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
- 14 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
- 15 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 16 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment-
- 17 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 18 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 19 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 20 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 21 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 22 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 23 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
- 24 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
- 25 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
- 26 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
- 27 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
- 28 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State-
- 29 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
- 30 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution

- 1 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
- 2 medical assistance program.

- 13 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year-
- 14 beginning July 1, 2015, and for the payment of bills incurred

- (e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund. The
