AN ACT

- Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other offenses, providing for the offense of prohibited distribution of a private image; and, in rights of action, further providing for damages in actions for unlawful dissemination of intimate image.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 10 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 11 § 7507.2. Prohibited distribution of a private image.
- 12 <u>(a) Offense defined.--No person, without permission or</u>
- 13 authority, shall knowingly or recklessly disseminate or
- 14 <u>distribute from the possession or control of another person,</u>
- 15 including from a computer, computer system, computer network,
- 16 <u>electronic device or electronic storage system, a visual</u>
- 17 depiction of the other person in a state of full or partial
- 18 nudity or engaged in sexual conduct.
- 19 (b) Grading. -- The following shall apply:

- 1 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), a violation
- 2 <u>of subsection (a) is a misdemeanor of the third degree.</u>
- 3 (2) A violation of subsection (a) is a misdemeanor of
- 4 <u>the first degree when the victim is a minor or the offender</u>
- 5 <u>has previously been convicted under this section or a similar</u>
- 6 provision in another jurisdiction.
- 7 (c) Concurrent jurisdiction to prosecute. -- In addition to
- 8 the powers and duties conferred by the act of October 15, 1980
- 9 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act, the
- 10 Attorney General may investigate and prosecute any act or
- 11 continuing series of acts in violation of this section that
- 12 <u>involve multiple counties or a foreign state.</u>
- 13 <u>(d) Territorial applicability.--A person may be convicted</u>
- 14 <u>under the provisions of this section if either the victim or the</u>
- 15 offender is located within this Commonwealth.
- 16 (e) Nonapplicability. -- This section shall not apply to a law
- 17 enforcement officer performing the law enforcement officer's
- 18 official duties.
- 19 (f) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 20 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 21 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 22 "Disseminate." As defined under section 6321(q) (relating to
- 23 transmission of sexually explicit images by minor).
- 24 "Distribute." To deliver or pass on to a third person,
- 25 including by providing an electronic address or other means of
- 26 direct access to a visual depiction on a computer, computer
- 27 <u>system, computer network, electronic device or electronic</u>
- 28 storage system.
- 29 <u>"Full or partial nudity." As defined under section 7507.1</u>
- 30 (relating to invasion of privacy).

- 1 <u>"Sexual conduct."</u> As defined under section 5903(e) (relating_
- 2 to obscene and other sexual materials and performances).
- 3 "Visual depiction." As defined under section 6321(g).
- 4 Section 2. Section 8316.1(a) of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 5 § 8316.1. Damages in actions for unlawful dissemination of
- 6 intimate image <u>and prohibited distribution of a</u>
- 7 <u>private image</u>.
- 8 (a) Cause of action established. -- A person may bring a civil
- 9 cause of action based upon unlawful dissemination of intimate
- 10 image, as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 3131 (relating to unlawful
- 11 dissemination of intimate image), or prohibited distribution of
- 12 a private image, as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. 7507.2 (relating to
- 13 prohibited distribution of a private image), in order to recover
- 14 damages for any loss or injury sustained as a result of the
- 15 violation.

- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
