8	"energy conservation measure" in section 3752 of Title 62 of the
9	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section
10	is amended by adding definitions to read:
11	§ 3752. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
13	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:

16	"Energy conservation measure." A program, facility
17	alteration or technology upgrade designed to reduce energy,
18	water, wastewater or other consumption or operating costs. The
19	term may include, without limitation:

2	(4) Heating, ventilating or air conditioning system
3	modifications [or], extension of systems to new or renovated
4	areas or system replacements.

6	(13) [Indoor air quality improvements.] <u>Systems that</u>
7	provide indoor air quality improvements or improved climate
8	<u>control.</u>
9	* * *
10	"Energy-related cost savings." As follows:
11	(1) A cost saving, except for an energy saving, that
12	results from the implementation of an energy conservation
13	measure.
14	(2) Sources of energy-related cost savings shall include
15	only the following:
16	(i) Avoided current or planned capital expense.
17	(ii) Transfer of responsibility for operating and
18	maintaining and equipment repair and replacement to the
19	energy savings company.
20	(iii) Avoided renovation, renewal or repair costs as
21	a result of replacing old and unreliable equipment and
22	systems or thermal improvements to the building envelope.
23	"Energy savings company." A commercial or nonprofit business
24	providing energy solutions, including designs and implementation
25	of energy savings projects, retrofitting, energy conservation,
26	energy infrastructure outsourcing, power generation and energy
27	supply and risk management.

29	"Operating costs." As follows:
30	(1) Reductions in expenses, including energy-related

2 <u>or the building envelope.</u>

3 <u>(2) The term includes:</u>

(i) Operating and maintenance savings.

necessary.

11 § 3754. CONTRACT PROVISIONS.

12 GENERAL RULE. -- A GUARANTEED ENERGY SAVINGS CONTRACT MAY (A) 13 PROVIDE THAT ALL PAYMENTS, EXCEPT OBLIGATIONS ON TERMINATION OF 14 THE CONTRACT BEFORE ITS SCHEDULED EXPIRATION, SHALL BE MADE OVER A PERIOD OF TIME. EVERY GUARANTEED ENERGY SAVINGS CONTRACT THAT 15 REOUIRES PAYMENTS OVER A PERIOD OF TIME SHALL PROVIDE THAT, 16 17 AFTER THE INITIAL YEAR OF THE CONTRACT, THE SAVINGS IN EVERY 18 SUBSEQUENT YEAR ARE GUARANTEED TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY TO MAKE 19 PAYMENTS UNDER THE CONTRACT DURING THAT YEAR. A GUARANTEED ENERGY SAVINGS CONTRACT SHALL EXPRESSLY STATE THE FINANCIAL 20 21 OBLIGATIONS THAT AN ENERGY SAVINGS COMPANY WILL REQUIRE USERS TO 22 PAY UPON A DECLARATION OF SAVINGS.

(c) Grants, subsidies or other payments.--Grants, subsidies or other payments from the Commonwealth to a governmental unit shall not be reduced as a result of energy <u>conservation measure</u> <u>cost</u> savings obtained as a result of a guaranteed energy savings contract during the life of the contract.
