- AN ACT Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in public safety, providing for safe opioid prescription and imposing powers and duties on certain Commonwealth agencies. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. 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§ 5101. Definitions.

shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 17

- 1 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 "College." Any of the following:
- 3 (1) A medical college.
- 4 (2) A medical training facility, including a school of
- 5 <u>nursing and a school of optometry.</u>
- 6 (3) A dental school.
- 7 (4) An osteopathic medical college or osteopathic
- 8 <u>medical training facility.</u>
- 9 <u>"Controlled substance." A drug, substance or immediate</u>
- 10 precursor included in Schedules II through V of section 4 of the
- 11 act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled
- 12 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
- "Licensing boards." The following:
- 14 <u>(1) The State Board of Dentistry.</u>
- 15 (2) The State Board of Medicine.
- 16 (3) The State Board of Nursing.
- 17 (4) The State Board of Optometry.
- 18 (5) The State Board of Osteopathic Medicine.
- 19 (6) The State Board of Podiatry.
- 20 "Opioid." Any of the following:
- 21 (1) A preparation or derivative of opium.
- 22 (2) A synthetic narcotic that has opiate-like effects
- but is not derived from opium.
- 24 (3) A group of naturally occurring peptides that bind at
- 25 or otherwise influence opiate receptors, including opioid
- 26 agonist.
- 27 § 5102. Safe opioid prescription education.
- 28 (a) Curriculum. -- Beginning August 1, 2017, the licensing
- 29 boards shall, by joint regulation, implement a safe prescription
- 30 of a controlled substance containing an opioid curriculum. The

- 1 curriculum may be offered in colleges or by providers approved
- 2 by the licensing boards and shall include all of the following:
- 3 (1) Current, age-appropriate information relating to
- 4 <u>pain management.</u>
- 5 (2) Multimodal treatments for chronic pain that minimize
- 6 the use of a controlled substance containing an opioid.
- 7 (3) If a controlled substance containing an opioid is
- 8 <u>indicated</u>, instruction on safe methods of prescribing a
- 9 <u>controlled substance containing an opioid that follow</u>
- 10 <u>quideline-based care.</u>
- 11 (4) Identification of patients who have risk factors for
- 12 <u>developing problems with prescription of a controlled</u>
- 13 <u>substance containing an opioid.</u>
- 14 <u>(5) Training on managing substance abuse USE disorders</u> <--
- 15 <u>as a chronic disease.</u>
- 16 (b) Separation from standardized curriculum. -- The education <--
- 17 required under this chapter shall not be considered part of the
- 18 college's curriculum necessary for graduation. THE EDUCATION <--
- 19 REOUIRED UNDER THIS CHAPTER SHALL NOT BE CONSIDERED TO BE A
- 20 MANDATE OF THE CURRICULUM NECESSARY FOR GRADUATION. NOTHING IN
- 21 THIS CHAPTER SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT A COLLEGE FROM
- 22 REQUIRING SUCH CURRICULUM TO BE NECESSARY TO GRADUATE AFTER
- 23 AUGUST 1, 2017.
- 24 § 5103. Temporary regulations.
- 25 In order to facilitate the prompt implementation of this
- 26 chapter, each licensing board may issue temporary regulations.
- 27 The following shall apply:
- 28 (1) The temporary regulations shall expire no later than
- two years after their issuance.
- 30 (2) The temporary regulations issued by each licensing

1	board shall not be subject to:
2	(i) Sections 201, 202 and 203 of the act of July 31,
3	1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the Commonwealth
4	Documents Law.
5	(ii) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181),
6	known as the Regulatory Review Act.
7	Section 2 This act shall take effect immediately
