A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of February 22 through 28, 2015, as
- 2 "Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Awareness Week" in
- 3 Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, The word AED is an acronym for the automated
- 5 external defibrillator; and
- 6 WHEREAS, AEDs are portable medical devices that use
- 7 electrodes to automatically analyze and detect cardiac
- 8 arrhythmia in patients who experience sudden cardiac arrest; and
- 9 WHEREAS, AEDs are able to produce a shock which stops the
- 10 heart and allows it to return to a normal rhythm, a process
- 11 called defibrillation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, AEDs are used in the event of a sudden cardiac
- 13 arrest, which is a condition in which the heart suddenly stops
- 14 pumping blood and quivers erratically; and
- WHEREAS, About 360,000 cases of sudden cardiac arrest occur
- 16 yearly, typically without any warning signs; and
- 17 WHEREAS, A person currently has about a 5% chance of

- 1 surviving an incident of cardiac arrest, which decreases 7% to
- 2 10% with every minute that passes after a person's heart stops
- 3 beating; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Optimal AED placement allows a person to grab the
- 5 AED and return to the victim within 90 seconds; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Given that a person's chances of surviving a sudden
- 7 cardiac arrest decrease so rapidly, it is important that AEDs
- 8 are readily available; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of February 22
- 10 through 28, 2015, as "Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
- 11 Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
