A RESOLUTION

Designating the week of October 18 through 25, 2015, as 1 "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania. 2 WHEREAS, "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" will bring 3 4 attention to the growing problems and issues facing homeless children throughout Pennsylvania and across the nation; and 5 WHEREAS, In 2014, on any given night in the United States, 6 7 more than 1.3 million children experienced homelessness according to the United States Department of Education; and 8 9 WHEREAS, The Federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act 10 states that children are homeless if they lack a fixed, regular 11 and adequate nighttime residence; and 12 WHEREAS, Homelessness negatively impacts children's physical 13 health, emotional and behavioral development and academic 14 success; and 15 WHEREAS, Children are the fastest growing segment of the 16 homeless population; and 17 WHEREAS, The number of homeless students attending public school in this Commonwealth increased by 18% between the 2012-18

1 2013 and 2013-2014 school year, an increase of more than double 2 the national average of 8%, according to statistics reported by 3 the United States Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, During the 2013-2014 school year, nearly 23,000
school-age children and youth were reported as experiencing
homelessness, which made up about 1% of the total Pennsylvania
public school enrollment population for that year; and
WHEREAS, In Allegheny County alone, almost 3,000 children

9 were homeless during the 2013-2014 school year; and

10 WHEREAS, Youth experiencing homelessness face many obstacles, 11 such as losing treasured possessions and dealing with hunger and 12 sleep deprivation; and

13 WHEREAS, A homeless family's constant moving disrupts 14 children's education, causing them to be absent from school 15 frequently, which often results in low test scores and twice the 16 likelihood of repeating a grade; and

WHEREAS, The National Coalition for the Homeless cites studies that show youth experiencing homelessness are set back academically three to six months; and

20 WHEREAS, The national school dropout rate for homeless 21 children is 60% higher than a child who does not have that 22 experience during the school year; and

23 WHEREAS, For more than 16 years, the Homeless Children's 24 Education Fund has advanced the education of children and youth 25 experiencing homelessness in Allegheny County in an effort to 26 combat such statistics by providing educational programs and services, acting as a trusted advocate, sharing expertise and 27 28 facilitating collaborative relationships that maximize the 29 collective impact among community partners; and 30 WHEREAS, Many events will take place during "Homeless

Children's Awareness Week" in Pittsburgh, including a story telling event, a performance art installation and a 5K and 10K
 run/walk to raise awareness about children experiencing
 homelessness; and

5 WHEREAS, Individuals and groups across this Commonwealth are 6 encouraged to create their own events during "Homeless 7 Children's Awareness Week" to raise awareness about the needs 8 and challenges of children and youth experiencing homelessness; 9 therefore be it

10 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of October 18 11 through 25, 2015, as "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in 12 Pennsylvania.
