A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study regarding overtime costs incurred by the Department of Corrections relating to staffing shortages. 3 WHEREAS, The Department of Corrections budget increased by 4 5 3.1% from fiscal year 2013-2014 to fiscal year 2014-2015; and 6 WHEREAS, The department requested an increase of 10% for 7 fiscal year 2015-2016, which does not include a \$56 million supplemental appropriation budget request to support unbudgeted 8 contract costs; and 10 WHEREAS, The department led all other State departments and 11 agencies for overtime costs from 2010 through 2014; and 12 WHEREAS, The department's overtime spending has increased by 13 more than 57% between 2009-2010 and 2013-2014; and 14 WHEREAS, The department spent more than \$85 million in 15 overtime costs in 2014-2015; and 16 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth has reduced the inmate level by 400 from 2010-2011 to 2011-2012 and more than 700 from 2012-2013 to 17

- 1 WHEREAS, It is critical to review staffing levels and
- 2 overtime requirements within the department to ensure tax
- 3 dollars are being utilized efficiently and effectively;
- 4 therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 6 be directed to conduct a study relating to the staffing levels
- 7 and mandatory overtime costs within the Department of
- 8 Corrections; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the study include comparisons to other states'
- 10 staffing levels compared to inmate levels and historical trends
- 11 relating to inmate population level increases and decreases; and
- 12 be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the study include cost comparisons of hiring
- 14 new employees within the department compared to paying current
- 15 employees overtime; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the study incorporate all aspects of staffing,
- 17 including salary, health care, retirement, training and
- 18 equipment required for each employee; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That in compiling this report the Legislative
- 20 Budget and Finance Committee seek input from the department, the
- 21 Office of Administration, the Appropriations Committee of the
- 22 Senate, the Judiciary Committee of the Senate, the
- 23 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives, the
- 24 Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives and the
- 25 Pennsylvania State Corrections Officers Association; and be it
- 26 further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 28 report its findings and recommendations to the Senate no later
- 29 than six months after the adoption of this resolution.
