| 3 | WHEREAS, For nearly 225 years, Americans have benefited from |
| 4 | the protection offered by the right to trial by an impartial |
| 5 | jury guaranteed by the Sixth Amendment to the Constitution of |
| 6 | the United States; and |
| 7 | WHEREAS, Since the Bill of Rights, which includes the Sixth |
| 8 | Amendment, was ratified in December 1791, the jury has acted as |
| 9 | an unbiased finder of truth and the most representative body of |
| 10 | citizens in our justice system; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, The jury has played a pivotal role in balancing the |
| 12 | scales of justice, equalizing the rights of the poor and |
| 13 | powerless with the privileges of the rich and powerful, securing |
| 14 | other allowed rights guaranteed by the Bill of Rights and, most |
| 15 | importantly, extending and preserving democracy; and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, Every year more than 225,000 Pennsylvanians report |
| 17 | for jury duty and more than 60,000 serve as jurors in both civil |

1 and criminal trials; and

2 WHEREAS, Only when citizens support the jury system and 3 appear when summoned can this pillar of our democracy fully 4 protect the rights of all citizens; therefore be it 5 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of May 23 6 through 27, 2016, as "Juror Appreciation Week" in Pennsylvania.
