A RESOLUTION

- Designating June 15, 2016, as "Elder Abuse Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Older Pennsylvanians should be recognized as a
- 4 valuable resource to this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, No one is immune to the threat of elder abuse; and
- 6 WHEREAS, It is an obligation of all residents to protect the
- 7 health, safety and welfare of this Commonwealth's elder
- 8 residents; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth received more than 20,800 reports
- 10 of elder abuse in 2014, and it is estimated that only one in
- 11 five cases of abuse is reported; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The act of November 6, 1987 (P.L.381, No.79), known
- 13 as the Older Adults Protective Services Act, requires that older
- 14 adults who lack the capacity to protect themselves shall have
- 15 access to and be provided with services necessary to protect
- 16 their health, safety and welfare; and
- 17 WHEREAS, A partnership exists between the Department of

- 1 Aging, the Pennsylvania Association of Area Agencies on Aging,
- 2 the Temple Institute on Protective Services, district attorneys,
- 3 county elder abuse task forces and State and local law
- 4 enforcement to investigate every allegation of elder abuse; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is necessary to increase awareness of the
- 6 incidents of elder abuse and to educate people about the methods
- 7 to report suspected cases of abuse; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate June 15, 2016, as "Elder
- 9 Abuse Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania and strive to increase
- 10 awareness every day about elder abuse and the resources in place
- 11 to prevent it from occurring.
