AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- Consolidated Statutes, in proprietary and official rights,
- further providing for wearing of uniforms and insignia.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 6701 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 6701. Wearing of uniforms and insignia and misrepresentation
- 9 <u>of military service or honors</u>.
- 10 (a) Wearing of uniforms and insignia. -- A person is guilty of
- 11 a summary offense if, without authority, he:
- 12 (1) wears or displays the uniform, decoration, insignia
- or other distinctive emblem of any branch of the armed forces
- of the United States or of any of the several states, or of
- any association, for the purpose of obtaining aid or profit,
- or while soliciting contributions or subscriptions; or

- 1 (2) wears an honorable discharge button issued or
- 2 authorized by the United States.
- 3 (b) Misrepresentation of military service or honors.--A
- 4 person commits a misdemeanor of the third degree if, with intent
- 5 to obtain money, property or other benefit, the person
- 6 fraudulently holds himself out to be any of the following:
- 7 (1) A member or veteran of any branch of the armed
- 8 <u>forces of the United States or of any of the several states.</u>
- 9 (2) The recipient of any decoration or medal authorized
- 10 by the Congress of the United States for the armed forces of
- the United States or any of the service medals or any
- decoration awarded to members of the armed forces of the
- 13 United States or of any of the several states.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
