AN ACT

Amending the act of May 1, 1984 (P.L.206, No.43), entitled "An

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act providing for safe drinking water; imposing powers and 2 duties on the Department of Environmental Resources in 3 relation thereto; and appropriating certain funds," further providing for powers and duties of the Department of Environmental Protection. 5 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. Section 5 of the act of May 1, 1984 (P.L.206, 10 No.43), known as the Pennsylvania Safe Drinking Water Act, is 11 amended by adding a subsection to read: 12 Section 5. Powers and duties of department. * * * 13 14 (a.1) Lead testing. -- The department shall monitor lead 15 levels in public water systems in accordance with the following: 16 (1) The department shall conduct testing for lead during 17 two consecutive six-month monitoring periods. (2) The department shall assign each public water system 18 in this Commonwealth to a monitoring period. Each public 19

<pre>water system shall be tested for lead under paragraph (1)</pre>
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- 2 (3) Following the initial monitoring periods, the
- 3 <u>department shall continue annual testing of public water</u>
- 4 systems for lead. The department may identify public water
- 5 systems that qualify for reduced monitoring. The monitoring
- 6 schedule shall be such that all sample sites of a public
- 7 <u>water system subject to reduced monitoring are tested for</u>
- 8 <u>lead at least once every three years.</u>
- 9 <u>(4) A public water system established after the</u>
- 10 effective date of this subsection shall be subject to
- 11 monitoring beginning with the next following monitoring
- 12 <u>period</u>.
- 13 (5) The results of lead testing conducted by the
- 14 <u>department shall be made available on the department's</u>
- publicly accessible Internet website. At a minimum, the data
- 16 <u>shall include lead levels for each public water system</u>
- 17 tested, the date of testing and any follow-up measures taken
- or planned.
- 19 (6) The lead testing shall occur in accordance with a
- 20 monitoring schedule established by the Environmental Quality
- 21 Board by regulation. In addition, the Environmental Ouality
- 22 Board shall promulgate any other regulations necessary to
- implement this subsection.

- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
