## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in community colleges, further 5 providing for the definition of "community college," for 6 powers and duties of State Board of Education, for powers and 7 duties of Board of Trustees, for degrees and for dissolution 8 of certain community colleges. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. Sections 1901-A(4), 1902-A(a)(1), 1905-A(a), 13 1912-A and 1914-A(c) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 14 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, are amended to 15 read: 16 Section 1901-A. Definitions. -- The following words and phrases, as used in this article, shall, unless a different 17 meaning is plainly required by the context, have the following 18 19 meaning: 20
- 21 (4) "Community college" shall mean a public college or

- 1 technical institute which is established and operated in
- 2 accordance with the provisions of this act by a local sponsor
- 3 which provides a two-year, four-year, postsecondary, college-
- 4 parallel, terminal-general, terminal-technical, out-of-school
- 5 youth or adult education program or any combination of these.
- 6 The community college may also provide area vocational-technical
- 7 education services and credit, nonremedial college courses to
- 8 secondary senior high school students.

- 10 Section 1902-A. Powers and Duties of State Board of
- 11 Education. -- (a) The State Board of Education shall have the
- 12 power, and its duty shall be:
- 13 (1) To adopt such policies, standards, rules and regulations
- 14 formulated by the Council of Higher Education, as may be
- 15 necessary to provide for the establishment, operation and
- 16 maintenance of community colleges, including minimum
- 17 requirements for physical facilities and equipment, curriculum,
- 18 faculty, standards and professional requirements, qualifications
- 19 for admission and advancement of students, student enrollment,
- 20 student population of the area to be served by the community
- 21 college, requirements for satisfactory completion of a two-year
- 22 <u>or four-year</u> program and the degrees or diplomas or certificates
- 23 to be awarded therefor, means of financing and financial
- 24 resources for the establishment and support of the community
- 25 college, standards under which the State Board of Education may
- 26 allow a community college to offer baccalaureate degrees and
- 27 <u>standards under which the State Board of Education shall</u>
- 28 <u>determine the baccalaureate degrees a community college may be</u>
- 29 <u>allowed to offer</u> and all matters necessary to effectuate the
- 30 purposes of this act.

- 2 Section 1905-A. Powers and Duties of Board of Trustees. -- (a)
- 3 The affairs of any community college established under this act
- 4 shall be administered and supervised by a board of trustees.
- 5 Subject to any law and to any policies, standards, rules and
- 6 regulations adopted by the State Board of Education provided for
- 7 community colleges, the board shall, for the purpose of
- 8 establishing, operating and maintaining a community college,
- 9 have the power, and its duty shall be:
- 10 (1) To appoint and fix the salary of a president.
- 11 (2) To hold, rent, lease, sell, purchase and improve land,
- 12 buildings, furnishings, equipment, materials, books and
- 13 supplies.
- 14 (3) To enter into contracts for services with schools,
- 15 colleges or universities, or with school districts or
- 16 municipalities, to effectuate the purposes of this act.
- 17 (4) To accept and receive gifts of real and personal
- 18 property and Federal, State and local moneys and grants, and to
- 19 expend the same.
- 20 (5) To make policies providing for the admission and
- 21 expulsion of students, the degrees to be offered, the courses of
- 22 instruction, the tuition and fees to be charged and for all
- 23 matters related to the government and administration of the
- 24 college.
- 25 (6) To submit to the State Board of Education for its
- 26 approval proposed amendments to the community college plan.
- 27 <u>including any proposal to offer baccalaureate degrees pursuant</u>
- 28 to section 1912-A(b).
- 29 (7) To enter into contracts for services to high schools of
- 30 member districts to provide area vocational-technical education

- 1 services.
- 2 (8) To exercise such other powers and perform such other
- 3 duties as are necessary to carry into effect the purposes of
- 4 this act.

- 6 Section 1912-A. Degrees.--(a) The State Board of Education
- 7 shall prescribe the types of diplomas, certificates or degrees
- 8 that may be granted students who complete post-secondary
- 9 education courses in community colleges.
- (b) (1) Upon request by an established community college to
- 11 <u>amend its community college plan to allow the community college</u>
- 12 to offer baccalaureate degree programs, the State Board of
- 13 Education may allow a community college to offer baccalaureate
- 14 degree programs where the State Board of Education determines
- 15 that both of the following apply:
- 16 (i) The community college:
- 17 (A) is located in a rural geographic area of this
- 18 Commonwealth;
- 19 (B) is located in a geographic area that is underserved by
- 20 other colleges or universities offering baccalaureate degrees;
- 21 or
- 22 (C) seeks to offer a baccalaureate degree program that is
- 23 <u>not offered by any other college or university serving the</u>
- 24 geographic area in which the community college is located; and
- 25 <u>(ii) The board of trustees of the community college has</u>
- 26 demonstrated that each local sponsor of the community college
- 27 has approved the request by resolution adopted by a majority
- 28 vote at a public meeting of the local sponsor.
- 29 (2) In approving the request of a community college to offer
- 30 baccalaureate degree programs pursuant to this subsection, the

- 1 State Board of Education shall specify the baccalaureate degree
- 2 programs the community college is allowed to offer.
- 3 (3) The State Board of Education shall promulgate
- 4 regulations pursuant to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633,
- 5 No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act," in order to
- 6 <u>implement this subsection.</u>
- 7 Section 1914-A. Dissolution of Certain Community Colleges.--
- 8 \* \* \*
- 9 (c) The corporate successor of a dissolved community college
- 10 shall continue to have the authority to grant <a href="mailto:baccalaureate">baccalaureate</a>
- 11 <u>degrees</u>, associate degrees and certificates in those programs in
- 12 which the dissolved community college had the authority to grant
- 13 degrees during the last complete school year of operation as a
- 14 community college. If a corporate successor desires to offer
- 15 additional associate degree programs, it must apply to the
- 16 Department of Education to obtain approval in accordance with
- 17 applicable regulations. If a corporate successor desires to
- 18 offer additional certificates, it shall apply for licensure to
- 19 the State Board of Private Licensed Schools. [A corporate
- 20 successor of a dissolved community college is not authorized to
- 21 award baccalaureate degrees.] <u>If a corporate successor desires</u>
- 22 <u>to offer baccalaureate degree programs, it must apply to the</u>
- 23 State Board of Education pursuant to section 1912-A(b).

- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
