AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 14, 1961 (P.L.604, No.304), entitled
2 "An act relating to apprenticeship and training; creating a
3 State Apprenticeship and Training Council in the Department
4 of Labor and Industry to formulate an apprenticeship and
5 training policy and program, and defining its powers and
6 duties and providing for administration," further providing
7 for powers and duties; providing for supervision; and
8 abrogating a regulation.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. Section 4 of the act of July 14, 1961 (P.L.604,
12 No.304), known as The Apprenticeship and Training Act, is
13 amended to read:

14 Section 4. Powers and Duties.--(a) The council shall (1)
15 establish standards for apprenticeship in conformity with the
16 provisions of this act and applicable statutes and regulations
17 of the Federal Government; (2) adopt such rules and regulations,
18 subject [only] to section 4.1 and the approval of the Secretary

1 of Labor and Industry, as may be necessary to carry out the
2 intent and purpose of this act; (3) compile such data on
3 population and employment trends, industrial production,
4 vocational and industrial education and job requirements as may
5 be deemed necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this
6 act; (4) to terminate or cancel any apprenticeship agreements in
7 accordance with the provisions of such agreements or order
8 modifications of such agreements; (5) maintain close liaison
9 with Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, the United States
10 Department of Labor, the State Board of Vocational Education,
11 the Department of Public Instruction, the Department of
12 Commerce, Bureau of Rehabilitation of the Department of Labor
13 and Industry, and Juvenile Forestry Camps under the Department
14 of Public Welfare, and such other agencies which carry on
15 programs closely related to the purposes of this act; (6)
16 conduct studies, surveys and investigations of the special
17 problems of retraining or training unemployed or employed
18 persons to improve or modernize work skills and make appropriate
19 recommendations to cooperating agencies described above, local
20 community organizations, local school boards and the Secretary
21 of Labor and Industry; (7) act as a convening agency in local
22 communities to bring together local representatives of employes,
23 employers, educational agencies and industrial development
24 agencies in order to promote closer local cooperation in
25 establishing better apprenticeship and other training programs
26 including programs for employed persons who wish to improve and
27 modernize their work skills; (8) use appropriate media of
28 information and education to acquaint employers, employes and
29 the public at large with the advantages and availability of
30 apprenticeship and other occupational training programs; (9)

1 study the effectiveness of apprenticeship agreements and make
2 recommendations in accordance with the provisions of such
3 agreements for their improvement; and (10) perform such other
4 duties as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions
5 of this act.

6 (b) The council shall make a report to the Secretary of the
7 Department of Labor and Industry, on or before February
8 fifteenth, each year, indicating the extent of apprenticeship
9 and other occupational training programs during the previous
10 year, trends in employment requiring adjustments in
11 apprenticeship training and other occupational programs, needs
12 for expansion of apprenticeship and other occupational training
13 programs, activities of the council and such recommendations as
14 are in accord with the purposes of this act.

15 (c) No action affecting the status of an agreement shall be
16 taken by the council until an attempt has been made to bring the
17 employes and employer together to settle the problem in
18 conformity with the standards of the council.

19 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

20 Section 4.1. Supervision.--Regulations under section 4(a)(2)
21 may not require more than one supervisor for each apprentice or
22 trainee.

23 Section 3. The provisions of 34 Pa. Code § 83.5(b)(7) are
24 abrogated.

25 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
