AN ACT

- 1 Requiring State agencies to establish language access plans.
- 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 3 hereby enacts as follows:
- 4 Section 1. Short title.
- 5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the State Agency
- 6 Language Access Plan Act.
- 7 Section 2. Declaration of policy.
- 8 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 9 (1) The inability to speak, understand or read the
- 10 English language is a barrier that prevents access to public
- 11 services provided by State departments, agencies and
- 12 programs.
- 13 (2) The public services available through these entities
- 14 are essential to the welfare of Pennsylvania residents.
- 15 (3) It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure
- 16 that State departments, agencies and programs provide equal
- 17 access to public services for individuals with limited

- 1 English proficiency.
- 2 Section 3. Definitions.
- 3 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 4 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 5 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 6 "Equal access." The ability to be informed of, participate
- 7 in and benefit from public services offered by a State
- 8 department, agency or program at a level equal to English-
- 9 proficient individuals.
- 10 "Language access plan." A written plan that identifies the
- 11 languages spoken by at least 3% of the overall population within
- 12 the geographic area served by a local office of a State program
- 13 as measured by the United States Census and that demonstrates
- 14 the steps that will be taken to provide meaningful language
- 15 access to populations with limited English proficiency.
- 16 "Limited English proficiency." The inability to adequately
- 17 understand or express oneself in the spoken or written English
- 18 language.
- "Oral language services." Methods to provide verbal
- 20 information and interpretation, including, but not limited to,
- 21 staff interpreters, bilingual staff, telephone interpreter
- 22 programs and private interpreter programs.
- 23 "Program." The operations of a State agency.
- 24 "Secretary." The Secretary of Administration of the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- "State agency." A department, agency, board, commission or
- 27 office of the Commonwealth, including the Auditor General,
- 28 Attorney General and State Treasurer.
- 29 "Vital documents." Applications or informational materials,
- 30 notices and complaint forms offered by State agencies.

- 1 Section 4. Language access plans.
- 2 (a) Duty to establish. -- The Senate, the House of
- 3 Representatives and a State agency shall create a language
- 4 access plan that demonstrates reasonable steps that will be
- 5 taken to provide equal access to public services for individuals
- 6 with limited English proficiency.
- 7 (b) Reasonable steps.--Reasonable steps include, but are not
- 8 limited to:
- 9 (1) The provision of oral language services for
- 10 individuals with limited English proficiency, which services
- 11 must be face-to-face, in-house oral language services if
- 12 contact between the agency and individuals with limited
- 13 English proficiency is on a weekly or more frequent basis.
- 14 (2) The translation of vital documents ordinarily
- provided to the public into any language spoken by a limited
- 16 English proficient population that constitutes 3% of the
- 17 overall population within the geographic area served by a
- local office of a State program or a member of the Senate or
- 19 the House of Representatives as measured by the United States
- 20 Census.
- 21 (3) The provision of vital documents translated under
- 22 paragraph (2) on a Statewide basis to local offices as
- 23 necessary.
- 24 (4) Additional methods or means necessary to achieve
- 25 equal access to public services.
- 26 Section 5. Publication.
- 27 (a) Submission to secretary.--
- 28 (1) Each State agency, except the Auditor General,
- 29 Attorney General and State Treasurer, shall submit its
- 30 language access plan to the secretary within six months of

- 1 the effective date of this section.
- 2 (2) The secretary shall provide central coordination and
- 3 technical assistance to aid compliance with this section.
- 4 (3) The secretary shall publish the language access
- 5 plans on a publicly accessible Internet website.
- 6 (b) Other agencies. -- The Auditor General, Attorney General,
- 7 State Treasurer, Senate and House of Representatives shall
- 8 develop a language access plan and publish the language access
- 9 plan on a publicly accessible Internet website within six months
- 10 of the effective date of this section.
- 11 (c) Implementation. -- Language access plans published under
- 12 this section shall be implemented within one year of
- 13 publication.
- 14 (d) Biennial review. -- A language access plan published under
- 15 subsection (a) shall be reviewed and resubmitted every two years
- 16 based on a schedule determined by the secretary.
- 17 Section 6. Municipalities.
- 18 (a) General rule. -- A municipality may adopt a language
- 19 access plan.
- 20 (b) Duty of Governor's Center for Local Government
- 21 Services.--The Governor's Center for Local Government Services
- 22 shall assist municipalities in drafting and implementing
- 23 language access plans under this act.
- 24 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
