## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for study requirements prior to transferring a power, 2 duty or function of a Commonwealth agency.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Study requirements.
- 6 (a) General rule. -- Notwithstanding any other act to the
- 7 contrary, there shall be no transfer of a power, duty or
- 8 function of a Commonwealth agency until the following studies
- 9 are completed:
- 10 (1) A study on the financial impact of the
- 11 reorganization by the Legislative Budget and Finance
- 12 Committee.
- 13 (2) A study on the policy and programmatic implications
- and the impact on service delivery of the reorganization by
- 15 the Joint State Government Commission.
- 16 (b) Timing and submission. -- The studies required under this
- 17 act shall be completed within one year of the intended effective
- 18 date of a transfer described under subsection (a). The studies

- 1 shall be submitted to all of the following:
- 2 (1) The following committees of the Senate:
- 3 (i) Aging and Youth Committee.
- 4 (ii) Appropriations Committee.
- 5 (iii) Health and Human Services Committee.
- 6 (2) The following committees of the House of
- 7 Representatives:
- 8 (i) Aging and Older Adult Services Committee.
- 9 (ii) Appropriations Committee.
- 10 (iii) Health Committee.
- 11 (iv) Human Services Committee.
- 12 (c) Reorganization restriction. -- Sections 4 and 5 of the act
- 13 of April 7, 1955 (P.L.23, No.8), known as the Reorganization Act
- 14 of 1955, shall not apply to a transfer described under
- 15 subsection (a) until the studies required under this act are
- 16 completed or until specific legislation is enacted by the
- 17 General Assembly for this purpose.
- 18 Section 2. Effective date.
- 19 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
