## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of July 7, 2008 (P.L.654, No.55), entitled "An act providing for bituminous coal mines; and making a repeal," in emergency medical personnel, further providing for definitions, for emergency medical personnel, for regulations, for continuing training, for certification and for liability.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Sections 601, 602, 603, 605, 607 and 608 of the
10	act of July 7, 2008 (P.L.654, No.55), known as the Bituminous
11	Coal Mine Safety Act, are amended to read:
12	Section 601. Definitions.
13	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
14	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
15	context clearly indicates otherwise:
16	"Emergency medical responder." A coal mine employee who
17	complies with all of the following:
18	(1) Has been certified by the Department of Health as an
19	emergency medical responder.

1 (2) Has successfully completed all of the following 2 courses of additional training of the type approved by the Department of Health for emergency medical technicians: 3 (i) Patient assessment in the areas of splinting, 4 extremity manual, rigid and soft vacuum. 5 (ii) Spine care in the areas of: 6 (A) restricting spinal motion, helmet removal 7 and stabilization; and 8 9 (B) devices to restrict spinal motion. 10 (3) Has successfully completed any additional courses required by regulation of the board. 11 12 "Emergency medical technician." A coal mine employee [who 13 has successfully completed the course on emergency first aid 14 care and transportation of the sick and injured recommended by 15 the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons or an equivalent 16 organization and] who has been certified by the Department of 17 Health [to provide] as an emergency [care] medical technician. 18 "[Emergency medical technician paramedic] Paramedic." An 19 individual who has been certified by the Department of Health 20 [to provide emergency medical treatment] as a paramedic. 21 Section 602. Emergency medical personnel. 22 Emergency medical personnel shall be employed at every mine 23 as follows: 24 At least one <u>emergency medical responder or</u> (1)25 emergency medical technician shall be on duty at any time 26 when miners at that mine are engaged in the extraction, 27 production or preparation of coal. Emergency medical 28 responders or emergency medical technicians shall be on duty 29 at a mine in sufficient numbers to assure that no miner shall work in a mine location which cannot be reached in 30 minutes 30

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by an <u>emergency medical responder or an</u> emergency medical technician. Emergency <u>medical responders or emergency</u> medical technicians shall be employed at their regular duties at locations convenient for quick response to emergencies and shall have available to them at all times necessary equipment in compliance with Federal regulations.

7 (2) Telephone services or the equivalent facilities
8 shall be installed which shall provide two-way voice
9 communications between the <u>emergency medical responder or the</u>
10 emergency medical technician at the mine and medical
11 personnel outside or away from the mine who provide emergency
12 medical services on a regular basis.

13 (3) Operators shall make adequate provisions so that at 14 least one [emergency medical technician] paramedic, 15 registered nurse, physician or physician assistant is available to provide care at a mine at any time that 16 17 individuals are engaged in extraction, production or 18 preparation of coal. Emergency medical personnel under this 19 paragraph shall be on call to reach the entrance of the mine 20 within 30 minutes.

21 [Section 603. Regulations for training and certification.
22 The Department of Health shall promulgate regulations to
23 train and certify emergency medical technicians and emergency
24 medical technician paramedics.

25 Section 605. Continuing training.

The department, after consultation with the Department of Health regarding the content of instruction courses, shall provide for necessary training on a continuing basis of emergency medical technicians and emergency medical technician paramedics in sufficient numbers to satisfy the requirements of

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1 this chapter.]

2 Section 607. Certification.

3 The Department of Health shall promulgate regulations to 4 prescribe procedures necessary to certify <u>emergency medical</u> 5 <u>responders</u>, emergency medical technicians and [emergency medical 6 technician] paramedics and consult with the department as may be 7 required under this chapter.

8 Section 608. Liability.

9 (a) Physicians.--

(1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2), a physician
who in good faith gives instructions to [a certified] <u>an</u>
<u>emergency medical responder, an</u> emergency medical technician
[or emergency medical technician], <u>a</u> paramedic, a registered
nurse or a physician assistant shall not be liable for civil
damages as a result of issuing the instructions.

16 (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply where the actions
 17 constitute gross negligence, reckless misconduct or
 18 intentional misconduct.

19 (b) Other medical personnel.--

(1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2), [a certified]
an emergency medical responder, an emergency medical
technician, [emergency medical technician] a paramedic, <u>a</u>
registered nurse or <u>a</u> physician assistant who in good faith
attempts to render emergency care to a sick or injured
individual in or about a mine shall not be liable for civil
damages as a result of any acts or omissions.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply where the actions
 constitute gross negligence, reckless misconduct or
 intentional misconduct.

30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
