10	Section 1. Section 4572 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania <
11	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
12	§ 4572. Visual signals on authorized vehicles.

14	(d) Emergency towing lights The following shall apply:
15	(1) A tow truck may be equipped with one or more
16	flashing or revolving yellow lights and one or more flashing
17	or revolving red lights to remove a disabled vehicle under
18	one of the following conditions:
19	(i) Responding to a 911 dispatch.
20	(ii) Responding to a request from law enforcement

1	for the removal of a disabled vehicle.
2	(iii) Responding to a request from the owner or
3	operator of the disabled vehicle.
4	(2) The manner in which the light or lights shall be
5	displayed and the intensity shall be determined by regulation
6	of the department.
7	(3) The combination of yellow and red lights specified
8	in this subsection may be used only during the period in
9	which the tow truck is at the incident to which it was
10	dispatched or requested for the removal of a disabled
11	vehicle. Use of the combination lights to and from the
12	incident is prohibited.
13	(4) Unauthorized use of the lights specified in this
14	subsection shall be a summary offense punishable by a fine of
15	not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000.

CH. 55 (RELATING TO PARKING 23 AUTHORITIES) AND USED IN THE ENFORCEMENT OF 53 PA.C.S. CH. 57 24 (RELATING TO TAXICABS AND LIMOUSINES IN FIRST CLASS CITIES), A 25 VEHICLE OWNED BY A CITY OF THE FIRST CLASS AND OPERATED BY FIRST 26 JUDICIAL DISTRICT CERTIFIED ARMED PROBATION OFFICERS, A VEHICLE OWNED AND OPERATED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE COMMISSION THAT 27 28 IS USED BY AN EMERGENCY SERVICE RESPONDER AS DISPATCHED BY THE 29 PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE COMMISSION'S TRAFFIC OPERATIONS CENTER, OR ANY OTHER VEHICLE DESIGNATED BY THE STATE POLICE UNDER SECTION 30

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6106 (RELATING TO DESIGNATION OF EMERGENCY VEHICLES BY 1 2 PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE), OR A PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLE USED IN 3 ANSWERING AN EMERGENCY CALL WHEN USED BY ANY OF THE FOLLOWING: (1) A POLICE CHIEF AND ASSISTANT CHIEF. 4 5 (2) A FIRE CHIEF, ASSISTANT CHIEF AND, WHEN A FIRE 6 COMPANY HAS THREE OR MORE FIRE VEHICLES, A SECOND OR THIRD 7 ASSISTANT CHIEF. 8 (3) A FIRE POLICE CAPTAIN AND FIRE POLICE LIEUTENANT. 9 (4) AN AMBULANCE CORPS COMMANDER AND ASSISTANT 10 COMMANDER. A VEHICLE USED FOR THE 19 CURBSIDE COLLECTION OF MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE OR RECYCLABLES. 20 * * * SECTION 2. SECTION 4572(A) INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH OF TITLE 21 22 75 IS AMENDED AND THE SUBSECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING A 23 PARAGRAPH TO READ: 24 § 4572. VISUAL SIGNALS ON AUTHORIZED VEHICLES. 25 (A) FLASHING OR REVOLVING BLUE LIGHTS. -- AMBULANCE PERSONNEL, 26 VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS, CERTIFIED VOLUNTEER SEARCH AND RESCUE 27 ORGANIZATION MEMBERS AND OWNERS AND HANDLERS OF DOGS USED IN 28 TRACKING HUMANS MAY EACH EQUIP ONE MOTOR VEHICLE WITH NO MORE 29 THAN TWO FLASHING OR REVOLVING BLUE LIGHTS. THE FOLLOWING SHALL 30 <u>APPLY:</u>

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2 (7) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT PROHIBIT THE USE OF FLASHING 3 OR REVOLVING BLUE LIGHTS MOUNTED INTERNALLY IN THE PASSENGER 4 COMPARTMENT OF A PRIVATELY-OWNED VEHICLE USED IN ANSWERING AN EMERGENCY CALL THAT OTHERWISE COMPLY WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S 5 6 REGULATIONS. 7 * * * 8 SECTION 3. TITLE 75 IS AMENDED BY ADDING SECTIONS TO READ: 9 § 4572.1. FLASHING OR REVOLVING YELLOW AND WHITE LIGHTS. 10 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- TOW TRUCKS MAY BE EQUIPPED WITH ONE OR MORE FLASHING OR REVOLVING YELLOW LIGHTS AND ONE OR MORE 11 FLASHING OR REVOLVING WHITE LIGHTS. THE MANNER IN WHICH THE 12 13 LIGHT OR LIGHTS SHALL BE DISPLAYED AND THE INTENSITY SHALL BE DETERMINED BY REGULATION OF THE DEPARTMENT. 14 (B) LIMITATIONS.--THE FLASHING OR REVOLVING YELLOW AND WHITE 15 LIGHTS ON TOW TRUCKS SHALL BE ACTIVATED ONLY WHEN THE VEHICLE IS 16 17 ACTIVELY PERFORMING THE TYPE OF WORK WHICH IS THE BASIS OF THE 18 DESIGNATION OF THE VEHICLE AS AN AUTHORIZED VEHICLE OR IS WITHIN 19 THE VICINITY OF AN EMERGENCY RESPONSE AREA. TOW TRUCKS SHALL NOT 20 OPERATE WITH ACTIVATED FLASHING OR REVOLVING YELLOW AND WHITE 21 LIGHTS WHEN: 22 (1) NOT ENGAGED IN THE ACT OF TOWING A VEHICLE. 23 (2) BRAKE LIGHTS, TURN SIGNALS AND OPERATING LIGHTS ARE 24 VISIBLE FROM THE REAR AND NOT OBSTRUCTED. 25 (3) THE VEHICLE BEING TOWED DOES NOT TRAIL BEHIND THE 26 TOW TRUCK AND IS SECURELY POSITIONED ON THE FLATBED OF THE 27 TOW TRUCK WITH NO PARTS OF THE TOWED VEHICLE OVERHANGING. 28 (C) PENALTY.--UNAUTHORIZED USE OF THE LIGHTS SPECIFIED IN 29 THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE A SUMMARY OFFENSE PUNISHABLE BY A FINE 30 OF \$50.

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1 § 4572.2. SOLID WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLES.

2 (A) GENERAL RULE.--UPON APPROACHING AND PASSING A STATIONARY 3 SOLID WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLE THAT IS GIVING A VISUAL SIGNAL BY MEANS OF BRIGHT YELLOW STROBE LIGHT AS REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION 4 5 (B), THE DRIVER OF AN APPROACHING VEHICLE SHALL PROCEED AS 6 FOLLOWS: 7 (1) MAKE A LANE CHANGE INTO A LANE NOT ADJACENT TO THE 8 SOLID WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLE, IF POSSIBLE IN THE EXISTING 9 SAFETY AND TRAFFIC CONDITIONS; OR 10 (2) IF A LANE CHANGE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) WOULD BE IMPOSSIBLE, PROHIBITED BY LAW OR UNSAFE, REDUCE THE SPEED OF 11 12 THE MOTOR VEHICLE TO A REASONABLE AND PROPER SPEED FOR THE 13 EXISTING ROAD AND TRAFFIC CONDITIONS, WHICH SHALL BE LESS 14 THAN THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT, AND BE PREPARED TO STOP. (B) REQUIREMENTS FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLES. -- SOLID 15 16 WASTE COLLECTION VEHICLES SHALL BE EOUIPPED WITH A BRIGHT YELLOW STROBE LIGHT AFFIXED TO THE ROOF, WHICH SHALL BE MOUNTED TO 17 18 PROVIDE VISIBILITY TO VEHICLES APPROACHING FROM ANY DIRECTION, 19 IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS. THE STROBE LIGHT SHALL BE ACTIVE WHILE STOPPED UPON A STREET AND WHILE ENGAGED IN 20 THE COLLECTION OF GARBAGE, SOLID WASTES, RECYCLABLES AND REFUSE 21 OR WHILE MOVING BETWEEN STOPS AT A SPEED NOT GREATER THAN 10 22 23 MILES PER HOUR.

24 Section 2 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
