AN ACT

- Designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 1008 over the Codorus Creek in East Manchester Township and Hellam Township, York County, as the SPC Martin Wilson Kondor Memorial Bridge-; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 119 OVER THE PINE RUN CREEK, RAYNE TOWNSHIP, INDIANA COUNTY, AS THE PFC FRANK ENZER WEISS UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS BRIDGE; DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE ON 7 8 STATE ROUTE 125 BEFORE RIDGE ROAD IN PITMAN, SCHUYLKILL COUNTY, AS THE ABNER YODER MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 562 IN BERKS COUNTY AS THE GENERAL 10 CARL A. SPAATZ MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; AND DESIGNATING PORTIONS OF 11 INTERSTATE ROUTE 176 IN NEW MORGAN BOROUGH, CAERNARVON 12 TOWNSHIP, ROBESON TOWNSHIP AND CUMRU TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, 13 AS THE VIETNAM WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY, THE PERSIAN GULF WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY AND THE IRAO AND 15 AFGHANISTAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 hereby enacts as follows:
- 19 Section 1. SPC Martin Wilson Kondor Memorial Bridge.
- 20 Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 21 follows:
- 22 SPC Martin Wilson Kondor, a United States Army

- 1 Specialist, was killed in action at age 20 while serving in
- 2 Baqubah, Iraq, on April 29, 2004.
- 3 (2) The personal security detail on which SPC Kondor
- 4 served was surrounded in a crossfire attack while he was an
- 5 M240 gunner assigned to Headquarters Company, 3rd Brigade,
- 6 1st Infantry Division, in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.
- 7 (3) SPC Kondor demonstrated personal courage and
- 8 technical expertise in the face of a determined enemy during
- 9 a devastating ambush. His bravery and valor under fire saved
- 10 the lives of his fellow soldiers.
- 11 (4) In recognition of his service, SPC Kondor was
- 12 awarded the Bronze Star medal with the "V" Device and the
- 13 Purple Heart.
- 14 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on State Route 1008
- 15 over the Codorus Creek in East Manchester Township and Hellam
- 16 Township, York County, is designated as the SPC Martin Wilson
- 17 Kondor Memorial Bridge.
- 18 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 19 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to

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- 20 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 21 SECTION 2. PFC FRANK ENZER WEISS UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS
- BRIDGE.
- 23 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 24 FOLLOWS:
- 25 (1) PFC FRANK ENZER WEISS, A NATIVE OF TANOMA, SERVED IN
- THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS G COMPANY, 2ND BATTALION, 4TH
- 27 MARINES, 3RD MARINE DIVISION, III MARINE AMPHIBIOUS FORCE.
- 28 (2) ON MARCH 18, 1968, PFC WEISS, 19 YEARS OF AGE, WAS
- 29 KILLED IN ACTION BY HOSTILE FIRE IN QUANG TRI PROVINCE, SOUTH
- 30 VIETNAM.

- 1 (3) PFC WEISS WAS AWARDED THE PURPLE HEART, NATIONAL
- 2 DEFENSE SERVICE MEDAL, VIETNAM CAMPAIGN MEDAL AND VIETNAM
- 3 SERVICE MEDAL.
- 4 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON STATE
- 5 ROUTE 119 OVER THE PINE RUN CREEK IN RAYNE TOWNSHIP, INDIANA
- 6 COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED AS THE PFC FRANK ENZER WEISS UNITED STATES
- 7 MARINE CORPS BRIDGE.
- 8 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 9 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
- 10 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
- 11 SECTION 3. ABNER YODER MEMORIAL BRIDGE.
- 12 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 13 FOLLOWS:
- 14 (1) ABNER YODER GRADUATED FROM HEGINS HIGH SCHOOL IN
- 15 1936, WAS ACTIVE IN HIS LOCAL CHURCH AND PLAYED ON THE
- 16 PITMAN'S FARMERS BASEBALL TEAM.
- 17 (2) ON JULY 18, 1941, HE JOINED THE UNITED STATES ARMY
- 18 AIR CORPS AND ROSE TO THE LEVEL OF TECHNICAL SERGEANT BY
- 19 AUGUST OF 1943.
- 20 (3) DURING HIS TIME IN THE AIR CORPS, HE TRAVELED TO
- 21 AUSTRALIA, WHERE HE MET HIS FIANCÉE AND JOINED A COMBAT CREW
- 22 WHICH FLEW MISSIONS ON A B-52.
- 23 (4) ON FEBRUARY 17, 1944, THE PLANE HE WAS ON WITH HIS
- 24 CREW HAD ENGINE TROUBLES AND ATTEMPTED TO RETURN TO THE BASE
- 25 BUT STALLED AND CRASHED. THE ENTIRE CREW, INCLUDING ABNER
- 26 YODER, WAS KILLED IN THE PLANE CRASH.
- 27 (5) ABNER YODER WAS 26 AT THE TIME OF HIS DEATH AND HE
- 28 WAS BURIED AT THE MANILA AMERICAN CEMETERY IN MANILA, NEAR
- 29 OTHER FALLEN MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES.
- 30 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE ON STATE ROUTE 125 BEFORE RIDGE

- 1 ROAD IN PITMAN, SCHUYLKILL COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED AS THE ABNER
- 2 YODER MEMORIAL BRIDGE.
- 3 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 4 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
- 5 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
- 6 SECTION 4. GENERAL CARL A. SPAATZ MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 7 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 8 FOLLOWS:
- 9 (1) CARL ANDREW "TOOEY" SPAATZ WAS BORN IN BOYERTOWN,
- 10 BERKS COUNTY, ON JUNE 28, 1891.
- 11 (2) DRAWN TO AVIATION, AFTER GRADUATING FROM WEST POINT
- 12 IN 1914 AND BEING COMMISSIONED AS A SECOND LIEUTENANT IN THE
- 13 INFANTRY, MR. SPAATZ STUDIED AT THE AVIATION SCHOOL AT SAN
- 14 DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.
- 15 (3) MR. SPAATZ SERVED WITH THE 1ST AERO SQUADRON AS A
- 16 FIRST LIEUTENANT UNDER GENERAL JOHN "BLACK JACK" PERSHING
- 17 DURING THE PUNITIVE EXPEDITION INTO MEXICO.
- 18 (4) AFTER BEING PROMOTED TO CAPTAIN IN MAY 1917, MR.
- 19 SPAATZ SERVED IN FRANCE WITH THE AMERICAN EXPEDITIONARY
- 20 FORCES DURING WORLD WAR I AND, AS A FIGHTER PILOT, SHOT DOWN
- 21 THREE GERMAN FOKKER PLANES BEHIND ENEMY LINES, WHICH EARNED
- 22 HIM THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS.
- 23 (5) MR. SPAATZ WAS PROMOTED TO MAJOR ON JULY 1, 1920,
- 24 AND DURING THE INTERWAR YEARS HE PROCEEDED UP THE RANKS OF A
- 25 PEACETIME AIR CORPS.
- 26 (6) MR. SPAATZ WAS AWARDED THE DISTINGUISHED FLYING
- 27 CROSS FOR COMMANDING THE REFUELING ENDURANCE FLIGHT OF THE
- 28 QUESTION MARK PLANE FROM JANUARY 1 THROUGH 7, 1929, DURING
- 29 WHICH THE PLANE BROKE A RECORD FOR SUSTAINED FLIGHT.
- 30 (7) AFTER THE UNITED STATES ENTERED INTO WORLD WAR II,

- 1 IN 1942, MR. SPAATZ WAS NAMED CHIEF OF THE AIR FORCE COMBAT
- 2 COMMAND AND WAS SENT TO ENGLAND TO INITIATE THE PLANNING
- 3 STAGES FOR THE UNITED STATES ARMY AIR FORCES IN EUROPE.
- 4 (8) LATER IN 1942, MR. SPAATZ WAS NAMED COMMANDER OF THE
- 5 UNITED STATES ARMY AIR FORCES IN EUROPE.
- 6 (9) IN 1943, MR. SPAATZ COMMANDED THE TWELFTH AIR FORCE
- 7 IN NORTH AFRICA WHERE HIS FORCES PLAYED A PIVOTAL ROLE IN
- 8 REDUCING ERWIN ROMMEL'S AFRIKA KORPS.
- 9 (10) IN 1944, MR. SPAATZ RETURNED TO ENGLAND AND WAS
- 10 NAMED THE COMMANDING GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES STRATEGIC
- 11 AIR FORCES IN EUROPE.
- 12 (11) IN THIS ROLE, MR. SPAATZ PLAYED A KEY ROLE IN
- OPERATION OVERLORD, MORE COMMONLY KNOWN AS D-DAY, BY
- 14 DIRECTING THE ALLIED AERIAL ATTACKS COVERING THE LANDINGS ON
- 15 THE BEACHES OF NORMANDY.
- 16 (12) MR. SPAATZ ALSO COMMANDED THE STRATEGIC BOMBING OF
- 17 GERMANY.
- 18 (13) ON MARCH 11, 1945, MR. SPAATZ RECEIVED A TEMPORARY
- 19 PROMOTION TO GENERAL AND LATER WAS NAMED COMMANDER OF THE
- 20 UNITED STATES STRATEGIC AIR FORCES IN THE PACIFIC WHERE HE
- 21 SUPERVISED THE FINAL STRATEGIC BOMBINGS OF JAPAN, INCLUDING
- TWO ATOMIC BOMB MISSIONS.
- 23 (14) MR. SPAATZ WAS THE ONLY MAN OF GENERAL RANK OR
- 24 EQUIVALENT TO ATTEND ALL THREE SURRENDER CEREMONIES THAT
- 25 ENDED WORLD WAR II.
- 26 (15) IN 1946, MR. SPAATZ WAS NAMED COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF
- 27 THE ARMY AIR FORCES, AND IN 1947 HE WAS NAMED THE FIRST CHIEF
- 28 OF STAFF OF THE NEWLY INDEPENDENT UNITED STATES AIR FORCE.
- 29 (16) MR. SPAATZ RETIRED FROM MILITARY SERVICE IN 1948
- 30 AND PASSED AWAY ON JULY 14, 1974.

- 1 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 562 IN BERKS
- 2 COUNTY FROM THE INTERSECTION WITH STATE ROUTE 73 IN THE BOROUGH
- 3 OF BOYERTOWN TO THE INTERSECTION WITH STATE ROUTE 662 AT THE
- 4 TOWNSHIP LINE BETWEEN AMITY TOWNSHIP AND OLEY TOWNSHIP IS
- 5 DESIGNATED AS THE GENERAL CARL A. SPAATZ MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 6 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 7 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 8 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 9 SECTION 5. VIETNAM WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 10 (A) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF INTERSTATE ROUTE 176 IN NEW
- 11 MORGAN BOROUGH, CAERNARVON TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, FROM THE
- 12 MORGANTOWN INTERCHANGE OF THE PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE AT MILE
- 13 MARKER 0.4 TO MILE MARKER 3.7 IS DESIGNATED AS THE VIETNAM WAR
- 14 VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 15 (B) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 16 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 17 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 18 SECTION 6. PERSIAN GULF WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 19 (A) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF INTERSTATE ROUTE 176 IN
- 20 ROBESON TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, FROM MILE MARKER 3.7 TO MILE
- 21 MARKER 7.0 IS DESIGNATED AS THE PERSIAN GULF WAR VETERANS
- 22 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 23 (B) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 24 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 25 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 26 SECTION 7. IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 27 (A) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF INTERSTATE ROUTE 176 IN
- 28 ROBESON TOWNSHIP AND CUMRU TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, FROM MILE
- 29 MARKER 7.0 IN ROBESON TOWNSHIP TO MILE MARKER 10.3 AT OR NEAR
- 30 THE INTERSECTION OF U.S. ROUTE 422 IN CUMRU TOWNSHIP IS

- 1 DESIGNATED AS THE IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL
- 2 HIGHWAY.
- (B) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND 3
- 4 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 5 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 6 Section $\frac{2}{8}$ 8. Effective date.
