7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
9	as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to

11	Section 216. Work Requirements for the Supplemental
12	Nutrition Assistance Program(a) The department may not apply
13	for, accept or renew a waiver of requirements established under
14	section 5 6(0) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (Public Law <
15	88-525, 7 U.S.C. § 2015(o)) without prior approval of the
16	General Assembly.
17	(b) To the extent permitted by Federal law, as a condition

1	of participation and continuing eligibility for food assistance,
2	an adult recipient shall comply with and submit proof of
3	compliance with at least one of the following:
4	(1) The recipient has been employed for an average of at
5	least twenty hours per week.
6	(2) The recipient engaged in at least twenty-four hours of
7	community service per month.
8	(3) The recipient participates in a work program for at
9	least twenty hours per week.
10	(4) The recipient is enrolled as a full-time student in an
11	institution of higher education.
12	(c) Subsection (b) shall not apply to: <
13	(1) An adult recipient who is a single parent with custody
14	of a child under the age of twelve.
15	(2) An adult recipient who is determined to not be an able-
16	bodied person capable of compliance with subsection (b), as
17	determined by the secretary. INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE EXEMPT UNDER <
18	SECTION 6(0)(3) OF THE FOOD AND NUTRITION ACT OF 2008 (7 U.S.C.
19	<u>§ 2015(0)(3)).</u>
20	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
