5	hereby enacts as follows:

13	An agency submitting documentation used by the Office of the
14	Budget for preparation of the Governor's budget submission to
15	the General Assembly under section 613 of the act of April 9,
16	1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of

1	1929, shall place the original, unedited documents on the	<
2	agency's publicly accessible Internet website and the agency	
3	shall electronically notify members of the General Assembly.	
4	SUBMIT THE ORIGINAL, UNEDITED DOCUMENTS TO THE CHAIRPERSON AND	<
5	MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE	
6	SENATE AND THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE	
7	APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. The	
8	documents shall be available SUBMITTED no later than the first	<

17	<u>§ 501. Definitions.</u>	
18	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter	
19	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the	
20	context clearly indicates otherwise:	
21	"Commonwealth agency." Any office, authority, board,	
22	multistate agency or commission of the executive branch, an	
23	independent agency or a State-affiliated entity. The term	
24	includes any of the following:	
25	(1) The Governor's Office.	
26	(2) The Office of Attorney General.	
27	(3) The Department of the Auditor General.	
28	(4) The Treasury Department.	
29	(5) An organization established by the Constitution of	
30	Pennsylvania, a statute or an executive order which performs	

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1	or is intended to perform an essential government function.
2	(6) A legislative agency.
3	(7) A judicial agency.
4	"Independent agency." Any office, authority, board or agency
5	of the Commonwealth that is not subject to the policy,
6	supervision or control of the Governor.
7	"Judicial agency." Any of the following:
8	(1) The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
9	(2) The Superior Court of Pennsylvania.
10	(3) The Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.
11	<u>(4) The Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.</u>
12	"Legislative agency." As defined in section 102 of the act
13	of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know
14	Law.
15	"State-affiliated agency." Any of the following:
16	(1) The Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board.
17	(2) The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency.
18	(3) The State System of Higher Education.
19	§ 502. State Treasury transparency portal.
20	(a) DevelopmentThe State Treasurer shall develop and
21	maintain on the Treasury Department's publicly accessible
22	Internet website a transparency portal with information relating
23	to the Commonwealth's finances. The following shall apply:
24	(1) The transparency portal shall be made available to
25	the public and include figures and visual aids to demonstrate
26	growth or reduction in expenditures and revenue starting no
27	later than the 2014-2015 fiscal year.
28	(2) The visual aids required under paragraph (1) shall
29	include, but not be limited to, charts and graphs.
30	(3) Information provided by the Treasury Department

1	shall be made available to the public to download as an image
2	and spreadsheet document.
3	(b) General Fund informationThe following shall apply: <
4	(1) The State Treasurer shall provide on the
5	transparency portal an analysis of the General Fund updated
6	to accurately reflect the General Fund at the end of the
7	prior day, including:
8	(i) Cash flow within the General Fund which shall
9	include a line graph showing changes in cash flow with a
10	range starting from the 2014-2015 fiscal year.
11	(B) GENERAL FUND INFORMATIONTHE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY: <
12	(1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL PROVIDE ON THE
13	TRANSPARENCY PORTAL AN UPDATED ANALYSIS OF THE GENERAL FUND
14	TO ACCURATELY REFLECT THE GENERAL FUND AT THE END OF THE
15	CLOSE OF BUSINESS THE PREVIOUS DAY, INCLUDING:
16	(I) CASH FLOW WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND, INCLUDING
17	INFORMATION RELATED TO CHANGES IN CASH FLOW STARTING FROM
18	<u>THE 2014-2015 FISCAL YEAR.</u>
19	(ii) The current General Fund balance.
20	(iii) General fund expenditures. The public shall be
21	able to delineate expenditures under this subparagraph by
22	appropriation paid out of the General Fund by the
23	Commonwealth agency that made the expenditure.
24	(iv) General Fund revenues, including information
25	relating to the difference between estimated revenues
26	provided by the Independent Fiscal Office under section
27	<u>605-B of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175),</u>
28	known as The Administrative Code of 1929, for the given
29	fiscal year and actual revenues collected. The Treasury
30	Department shall also include a graph comparing changes

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1	within the General Fund revenues and General Fund
2	expenditures starting with the 2018-2019 fiscal year.
3	(2) In order to assist the State Treasurer in compiling
4	the information required under this subsection for the
5	analysis of the General Fund, each Commonwealth agency shall
6	provide the information to the Treasury Department in a file
7	format specified by the Treasury Department through interface
8	<u>files.</u>
9	(c) Budget SPECIAL FUND AND RESTRICTED ACCOUNT <
10	informationThe State Treasurer shall provide on the
11	transparency portal information relating to the General Fund to <
12	accurately reflect the Commonwealth's finances at the end of the
13	close of business the previous day, including:
14	(1) Expenditures from each of the Commonwealth's special
15	FUNDS or restricted accounts, including a breakdown of <
16	Commonwealth agency expenditures from within those funds.
17	(2) Daily changes in revenue and expenditures for the
18	Commonwealth's special FUNDS and restricted funds ACCOUNTS. <
19	(3) In order to implement this subsection, each
20	Commonwealth agency shall provide the Treasury Department
21	data collected under the Pennsylvania Web Accountability and
22	Transparency (PennWATCH) Act, in a file format stipulated by
23	the Treasury Department through interface files.
24	(d) Treasury investment informationThe State Treasurer_
25	shall provide information on the transparency portal relating to
26	the Commonwealth's investments managed by the Treasury
27	Department. The information shall include the daily balances of
28	each fund within the investment pools managed by the Treasury
29	Department. The State Treasurer shall ensure the information is
30	updated to reflect changes in investment pools and account
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1	balances from the close of business the previous day.
2	(e) Commonwealth programsThe State Treasurer shall
3	include in the transparency portal an analysis of the
4	appropriations for Commonwealth programs based on the
5	appropriations at the close of business for the prior day. The
6	analysis shall include each appropriation, total budgeted
7	appropriation, total augmenting revenue, total spent
8	appropriation and percentage of the total appropriation spent.
9	(f) Commonwealth Financial WatchThe State Treasurer shall
10	include in the transparency portal a Commonwealth Financial
11	Watch which includes:
12	(1) The top 20 highest expenditures as designated by
13	appropriation within the General Fund during the current
14	fiscal year starting with the 2018-2019 fiscal year.
15	(2) The 10 Commonwealth agencies with the highest dollar
16	amount of General Fund expenditures during the current fiscal
17	year starting with 2018-2019 fiscal year, including the
18	percent of the Commonwealth agency's General Fund
19	appropriation spent.
20	(g) Time periodAll information provided under this
21	section shall reflect changes within the Commonwealth's funds
22	starting no later than the 2018-2019 fiscal year.
23	§ 503. Duties of Commonwealth agencies.
24	<u>A Commonwealth agency shall provide the State Treasurer the</u>
25	data required for the operation of the transparency portal under
26	section 502 (relating to State Treasury transparency portal) in
27	a file format stipulated by the Treasury Department through
28	interface files.
29	<u>§ 504. Commonwealth checkbook.</u> <
30	(a) Access. The Office of the Budget shall provide access
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- 1 to the Integrated Central System under section 620.1 of the act
- 2 of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative
- 3 <u>Code of 1929, with inquiry only screens on its publicly</u>
- 4 <u>accessible Internet website to the following:</u>
- 5 <u>(1) Members of the General Assembly.</u>
- 6 <u>(2) The Independent Fiscal Office.</u>
- 7 <u>(3) The Department of the Auditor General.</u>
- 8 <u>(4) The general public.</u>
- 9 <u>(b) Expenses. The Office of the Budget shall pay for any</u>
- 10 <u>expenses to implement this section with unencumbered funds.</u>
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
