AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled
2	"An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of
3	controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics;
4 5	conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug,
6	Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of
7	controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring
8	registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the
9	revocation or suspension of certain licenses and
10	registrations; and repealing an act," providing for
11	dispensing of fentanyl.
12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. The act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known
15	as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, is
16	amended by adding a section to read:
17	Section 4.1. Dispensing of Fentanyl(a) Fentanyl and
18	fentanyl derivatives, as used in section 4(1)(ii)23, shall only

20	(1) During TO A PATIENT WHO IS BEING TREATED ON AN IN-
21	DATTENT BASIS OF REMAINS IN ORSERVATION STATUS OF DURING a

- 2 section 103 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known
- 3 as the "Health Care Facilities Act."
- 4 (2) To a patient in a hospice as defined in section 802.1 of <--

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- 5 the "Health Care Facilities Act."
- 6 (2) FOR USE IN PALLIATIVE OR HOSPICE CARE.
- 7 (3) FOR USE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF PAIN ASSOCIATED WITH
- 8 CANCER.
- 9 <u>(4) TO A PATIENT WHOSE TREATMENT IS ASSOCIATED WITH A</u>
- 10 MEDICAL EMERGENCY AS DOCUMENTED IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S MEDICAL
- 11 RECORD.
- 12 (B) IN INSTANCES WHERE, IN THE PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL JUDGMENT
- 13 OF THE PRESCRIBER, FENTANYL IS REQUIRED TO STABILIZE AN
- 14 INDIVIDUAL'S ACUTE MEDICAL CONDITION, THE PRESCRIBER MAY
- 15 PRESCRIBE NO MORE THAN A SEVEN-DAY SUPPLY OF FENTANYL. IN ORDER
- 16 FOR THIS SUBSECTION TO APPLY, THE PRESCRIBER MUST:
- 17 (1) DOCUMENT THE ACUTE MEDICAL CONDITION IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S
- 18 MEDICAL RECORD WITH THE PRESCRIBER; AND
- 19 (2) STATE THE REASON WHY ANOTHER MEDICATION IS NOT
- 20 APPROPRIATE TO ADDRESS THE ACUTE MEDICAL CONDITION.
- 21 (b) (C) The department, in consultation with the
- 22 <u>Pennsylvania State Police, shall issue an annual report to the</u>
- 23 General Assembly. The report shall contain the following:
- 24 (1) Information on the number of overdoses related to
- 25 fentanyl and the number of overdoses where fentanyl and opioids
- 26 were present.
- 27 (2) Any reduction in the dispensing of fentanyl.
- 28 (c) (D) This section shall expire two years after the <--
- 29 <u>effective date of this section.</u>
- 30 (E) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "PRESCRIBER" SHALL <--

- 1 HAVE THE MEANING GIVEN TO IT IN SECTION 3 OF THE ACT OF OCTOBER
- 2 <u>27, 2014 (P.L.2911, NO.191), KNOWN AS THE "ACHIEVING BETTER CARE</u>
- 3 BY MONITORING ALL PRESCRIPTIONS PROGRAM (ABC-MAP) ACT."
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
