## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the <--Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 3 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for certain institutions and organizations and for the payment of bills-6 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal yearending June 30, 2018; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home-11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check-14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight 18 19 Fund, the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development Restricted Receipts Account, the Justice Reinvestment Fund, the 20 Multimodal Transportation Fund, the State Racing Fund and the 21 ABLE Savings Program Fund to the Executive Department; to-22 23 provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 24 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019; to provide 25 appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal-26 year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for the proper operation 27 of several departments of the Commonwealth and the 28 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License-29 Fund money; and to provide for the appropriation of Federal 30 31 funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at 32 the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 33

- 21 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee-
- 22 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 23 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation-

- 25 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
