AN ACT

Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled 1 "An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of 2 controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics; 3 conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug, Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of 5 controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring 7 registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the 8 revocation or suspension of certain licenses and registrations; and repealing an act," further providing for 10 drug overdose response immunity. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 13.7(c) of the act of April 14, 1972 15 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, is amended to read: 16 17 Section 13.7. Drug Overdose Response Immunity .-- * * 18 (c) [Persons experiencing drug overdose events may not be 19 charged and shall be immune from prosecution as provided in 20 subsection (b) if a person who transported or reported and 21 remained with them may not be charged and is entitled to immunity under this section.] (1) A person experiencing a drug

- 2 prosecution if, within ten days after receiving medical_
- 3 attention for the drug overdose event, the person experiencing
- 4 the drug overdose event obtained a screening and received a
- 5 <u>referral for treatment from a properly accredited addiction</u>
- 6 services provider, including a certified recovery specialist or
- 7 <u>other trained medical professional.</u>
- 8 (2) A person who transported or reported and remained with a
- 9 person experiencing a drug overdose event may not be charged and
- 10 is entitled to immunity under this section.

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
