AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, further 5 providing for dental examinations and dental hygiene 6 services. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 1403 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 11 12 amended to read: 13 Section 1403. Dental Examinations and Dental Hygiene Services. -- (a) All children of school age in the Commonwealth, 14 (i) upon original entry into the school, (ii) while in the third 15 16 grade, and (iii) while in the seventh grade, shall be given a 17 dental examination by a school dentist or public health dental hygiene practitioner: Provided, however, That this requirement 18 shall not apply to those school districts or joint school boards 19 which have instituted a program of dental hygiene services as

- 1 provided in subsection (b) of this section.
- 2 (b) Any school district or joint school board may institute
- 3 a program of dental hygiene services for children of school age,
- 4 which program shall be approved by the Secretary of Health, and
- 5 for that purpose may employ dental hygienists.
- 6 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a school
- 7 district or joint school board may use a public health dental_
- 8 <u>hygiene practitioner to satisfy the requirements under this</u>
- 9 <u>section</u>.
- 10 (d) As used in this section, "public health dental hygiene
- 11 practitioner" shall have the same meaning given to that term in
- 12 <u>section 2 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76), known as</u>
- 13 "The Dental Law."
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
