A RESOLUTION

- Designating April 28, 2017, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in 2
 - Pennsylvania in memory of workers killed, injured and
- disabled in the workplace and in recognition of the efforts
- of the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council. 4
- WHEREAS, Every year in America, a great number of workers are
- killed as a result of workplace injuries and occupational
- 7 diseases; and
- WHEREAS, The Federal Bureau of Labor and Statistics has 8
- reported that in 2014, more than 4,679 workers suffered fatal
- injuries in the workplace and nearly 3 million individuals 10
- suffered nonfatal work-related injuries and illnesses; and 11
- 12 WHEREAS, In 2014, 175 Pennsylvania workers lost their lives
- 13 due to fatal accidents in the workplace; and
- 14 WHEREAS, While the official "National Workers' Memorial Day"
- is celebrated annually on April 28, the Greater Wilkes-Barre 15
- Labor Council and other concerned residents are determined to 16
- prevent these tragedies with a local observation of "National 17

- 1 Workers' Memorial Day" on April 27, 2017, as a day to remember
- 2 these victims of workplace injuries; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Through the local observance of this day, the
- 4 Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council renews efforts to seek
- 5 stronger safety and health protections, better standards and
- 6 enforcement and fair and just compensation, and improve the
- 7 health and safety of every American workplace; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
- 9 28, 2017, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania in memory
- 10 of workers killed, injured and disabled in the workplace and in
- 11 recognition of the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council's efforts
- 12 and the tenth annual local "Workers' Memorial Day" program and
- 13 candlelight vigil service.
