A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating April 28, 2017, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Each year on April 28, communities and worksites
4	around the world honor friends, family members and colleagues
5	who have been killed or injured on the job; and
6	WHEREAS, In 2015, the Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics
7	reported that more than 4,800 workers suffered fatal workplace
8	injuries, the highest rate since more than 5,200 fatal injuries
9	in 2008; and
10	WHEREAS, During 2015, more than 3 million nonfatal work-
11	related injuries and illnesses occurred; and
12	WHEREAS, During 2015, 173 workers lost their lives due to
13	workplace accidents in this Commonwealth, a decrease from 183
14	fatal workplace accidents in 2013; and
15	WHEREAS, Fatal occupational injuries in this Commonwealth

1 have ranged from a high of 354 in 1994 to a low of 168 in 2009; 2 and

3 WHEREAS, In 2015, the largest number of fatalities in this 4 Commonwealth occurred in the transportation and warehousing 5 sector, including the truck transportation sector; and 6 WHEREAS, The second largest number of fatalities in this 7 Commonwealth occurred in the construction industry, including 8 specialty trade contractors followed by the manufacturing 9 sectors; and

10 WHEREAS, While news reports often focus our attention on 11 disastrous workplace events, most of these workers die 12 individually with little public attention; and

WHEREAS, It is appropriate to honor the memory of the courageous and dedicated members of this Commonwealth's work force who have been injured or disabled or who have died as a result of workplace accidents or occupational diseases; and WHEREAS, It is appropriate to recognize the integrity and achievements of this Commonwealth's work force and the resulting economic growth of our Commonwealth; and

20 WHEREAS, It is appropriate to call for vigilance and 21 increased safety in the workplace; and

22 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives desires to pay tribute 23 to workers who have been injured or disabled or who have died as 24 a result of workplace accidents or occupational diseases; and 25 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives wishes to honor the 26 contributions of this Commonwealth's work force and call for 27 increased workplace safety; therefore be it

28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
29 28, 2017, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
