## A RESOLUTION

- Designating November 20, 2017, as "Kinship Caregiver Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Families are central to the well-being of our
- 4 communities, Pennsylvania and the nation as a whole, with
- 5 children being the future of our society; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Childrearing has traditionally been the
- 7 responsibility of biological parents with support from other
- 8 family members and the community; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Biological parents are not always able to raise
- 10 their children for numerous reasons, including illness,
- 11 substance abuse issues, incarceration, financial instability and
- 12 death; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The opioid epidemic in particular has torn apart
- 14 thousands of Pennsylvania's families, leaving many children
- 15 without parents who can care for them and straining the State's
- 16 ability to protect those children; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Approximately one-third of children entering the
- 2 foster care system are placed there because of parental drug
- 3 abuse; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Grandparents, siblings, aunts, uncles, cousins and
- 5 other kin are stepping forward in ever-increasing numbers to
- 6 assume full-time parental responsibility for children whose
- 7 parents are unable or unwilling to care for them; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Kinship care may be an informal, private arrangement
- 9 or involve child welfare services; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Kinship care can keep children out of the foster
- 11 care system and in their own communities, putting less strain on
- 12 an overloaded system, providing savings to the State and
- 13 potentially leading to better outcomes for children; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Studies have shown that kinship care leads to more
- 15 permanent placements and fewer social and behavioral issues for
- 16 children than foster care in general; and
- 17 WHEREAS, More than 100,000 children in Pennsylvania live with
- 18 a relative with no biological parent present; and
- 19 WHEREAS, These relative-headed families face enormous
- 20 challenges ensuring that the children in their care experience
- 21 structure, accountability, encouragement, affection, safety and
- 22 age-appropriate expectations; and
- 23 WHEREAS, As a result of this commitment, the home provided
- 24 for many of these children becomes their "forever" home and
- 25 their relatives become moms and dads in the truest sense; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Numerous resources, including grandfamilies.org,
- 27 Generations United, the National Kinship Alliance for Children
- 28 and the United States Children's Bureau within the United States
- 29 Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for
- 30 Children and Families, among others, provide information and

- 1 support to kinship caregivers in Pennsylvania; and
- 2 WHEREAS, November 20 is recognized as "Universal Children's
- 3 Day," intended to promote awareness of children's rights and the
- 4 welfare of children around the world; and
- 5 WHEREAS, On "Universal Children's Day" we take time to spread
- 6 awareness and honor the commitment of kinship caregivers;
- 7 therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 9 November 20, 2017, as "Kinship Caregiver Day" in Pennsylvania.
