1 2 3 4 5	consider the joint petition filed by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Department of Community and Economic Development and to increase access to high-speed Internet service in underserved areas of Pennsylvania.
6	WHEREAS, The Commonwealth has a long-standing commitment to
7	broadband deployment, especially in rural communities; and
8	WHEREAS, In April 2017, the Pennsylvania Public Utility
9	Commission (PUC) and the Department of Community and Economic
10	Development (DCED) filed a joint petition with the Federal
11	Communications Commission (FCC) as part of an ongoing effort to
12	address Pennsylvania's "digital divide" by preserving millions
13	of dollars in Federal funding intended to increase access to
14	high-speed Internet service in rural communities across this
15	Commonwealth; and
16	WHEREAS, Funding for the Connect America Fund Phase II (CAF
17	II) program is drawn from the Federal universal service
18	surcharges paid by State residents and businesses; and
19	WHEREAS, The CAF II program is intended to support the

- 1 deployment of broadband service in high-cost areas, including
- 2 many rural communities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Most incumbent local telephone companies serving
- 4 Pennsylvania's high-cost areas accepted the CAF II funding,
- 5 along with the commitment to meet Federal benchmarks for
- 6 broadband speed (10 Mbps download and 1 Mbps upload), but
- 7 Verizon companies did not; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The FCC plans to conduct an auction to allocate the
- 9 broadband funding that was not accepted by Verizon and hopefully
- 10 the FCC will consider the joint petition by the PUC and DCED to
- 11 approve a Pennsylvania-specific weighting factor to the upcoming
- 12 CAF II auction; and
- 13 WHEREAS, A total of 31 counties face the loss of at least \$1
- 14 million in funding for broadband deployment, including
- 15 Allegheny, Beaver, Blair, Cambria, Centre, Chester, Clarion,
- 16 Clearfield, Clinton, Columbia, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Forest,
- 17 Huntingdon, Indiana, Jefferson, Lebanon, Lycoming, Mercer,
- 18 Mifflin, Schuylkill, Snyder, Somerset, Tioga, Venango, Warren,
- 19 Wayne, Washington, Westmoreland and York; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Eight counties could lose \$5 million or more in
- 21 funding for high-speed Internet enhancements, including Centre,
- 22 Clearfield, Huntingdon, Indiana, Lycoming, Somerset, Warren,
- 23 Washington; and
- 24 WHEREAS, There appears to be a growing gap between
- 25 Pennsylvania communities and businesses that have access to
- 26 higher broadband speeds and those that do not; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Without the modifications requested by Pennsylvania
- 28 under CAF II, rural consumers are at risk of losing the full and
- 29 current Federal public support to receive modern broadband
- 30 services because of a private business decision; and

- 1 WHEREAS, If the request under the joint petition is declined,
- 2 these funds could be reallocated outside Pennsylvania, further
- 3 sanctioning the digital divide that these funds were designed to
- 4 remedy in the first place; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 6 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Federal Communications
- 7 Commission to favorably consider the joint petition filed by the
- 8 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Department of
- 9 Community and Economic Development and to increase access to
- 10 high-speed Internet service in underserved areas of
- 11 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 13 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania encourage businesses, local leaders
- 14 and other concerned parties, especially in rural communities, to
- 15 support efforts to preserve the approximately \$140 million in
- 16 funding intended to increase access to high-speed Internet
- 17 service in underserved areas of Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 19 the Chairperson of the Federal Communications Commission, the
- 20 Chairperson of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the
- 21 Secretary of Community and Economic Development and members of
- 22 the Pennsylvania Congressional Delegation.
