## A RESOLUTION

Expressing unwavering support for the men and women of Team USA participating in the XXIII Winter Olympic Games in 1 2 3 PyeongChang, Republic of Korea. WHEREAS, PyeongChang, Gangwon Province, Republic of Korea, 4 was selected to host the 2018 Olympic Winter Games by the 123rd 5 6 International Olympic Committee on July 6, 2011, the first time 7 the games will be held in the Republic of Korea since 1988 when 8 Seoul was the host city; and WHEREAS, On November 1, 2017, the PyeongChang Olympic Torch 9 relay began a journey of 2,018 kilometers, winding its way 10 through nine provinces and eight major cities across the 11 12 Republic of Korea, with Incheon Metropolitan City providing the 13 starting point; and 14 WHEREAS, The torch measures 700 mm in length, reflecting PyeongChang's altitude of 700 meters above sea level; and

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WHEREAS, The PyeongChang Olympic Winter Games will be held
for 17 days from February 9 through 25, 2018; and

3 WHEREAS, PyeongChang will be the stage for the opening and 4 closing ceremonies and most snow sports, while alpine speed 5 events will take place in Jeongseon, and ice sports will be held 6 in the coastal city of Gangneung; and

7 WHEREAS, The vision of the games is for the world's best 8 athletes to compete on Asia's center stage to launch new 9 horizons in winter sports and create a sustainable legacy for 10 Gangwon Province and the Republic of Korea; and

11 WHEREAS, The official emblem of the games symbolizes a world 12 open to everyone, combining the image of ice and snow, winter 13 sports stars and people from all over the world, coming together 14 in PyeongChang, where heaven meets earth; and

15 WHEREAS, The official mascot of the games, Soohorang, is a 16 white tiger, which has been long considered Korea's guardian 17 animal; and

WHEREAS, "Sooho," meaning protection in Korean, symbolizes protection offered to the athletes, spectators and other participants; "rang" comes from the middle letter of "Ho-rangi," the Korean word for "tiger," and is also the last letter of "Jeong-seon A-ri-rang," a cherished traditional folk song of Gangwon Province; and

24 WHEREAS, Athletes from across the world will converge in 25 PyeongChang to compete in 102 events in 15 sport disciplines, 26 including: alpine skiing, biathlon, bobsleigh, curling, cross-27 country skiing, figure skating, freestyle skiing, ice hockey, 28 luge, Nordi combined, short track speedskating, skeleton, ski 29 jumping, snowboarding and speed skating; and

30 WHEREAS, Over 200 athletes from across the United States will

be traveling to PyeongChang to participate in the games, including nine from this Commonwealth: Jamie Greubel Poser (bobsled), Ryan Gunderson, Chad Kolarik, Brian O'Neill and Ryan Zapolski (ice hockey), Summer Britcher, Andrew Sherk and Jayson Terdiman (luge) and John-Henry Krueger (short track speedskating); and

7 WHEREAS, The games will be the first ever to award over 1008 gold medals to participants; therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives express its 10 unwavering support for the men and women of Team USA as they 11 compete in the pinnacle of sporting events at the XXIII Winter 12 Olympic Games in PyeongChang, Republic of Korea; and be it 13 further

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives express its support for, and commend the preparation of, the Winter Olympic Games' host city, PyeongChang, the host province, Gangwon, and the host country, the Republic of Korea, a longtime ally and friend of the United States of America.
