INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, MARCH 6, 2018

A RESOLUTION

1	Designating March 21, 2018, as "Kick Butts Day" in Pennsylvania
2	WHEREAS, Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable
3	death in the United States, imposing a terrible toll on
4	families, businesses and government in terms of health, lives
5	and dollars; and
6	WHEREAS, Tobacco kills more than 480,000 people annually,
7	more than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, illegal drugs, murders
8	and suicides combined; and
9	WHEREAS, Tobacco costs the United States more than \$170
10	billion in health care expenditures and \$156 billion in lost
11	productivity each year; and
12	WHEREAS, While the United States has made major progress
13	against tobacco use, nearly one in five Americans still smokes;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, Each day, more than 3,200 youths under 18 years of

age try smoking for the first time and more than 2,100 youths
become new regular, daily smokers; and

3 WHEREAS, One in thirteen of these youths will die prematurely4 because of tobacco use; and

5 WHEREAS, Each year, 540 million packs of cigarettes are 6 consumed by children; and

7 WHEREAS, Approximately 53,800 people die each year from8 exposure to secondhand smoke; and

9 WHEREAS, In the United States, more than 16 million people 10 currently suffer from smoking-caused illnesses; and 11 WHEREAS, The tobacco industry spends approximately \$8.9 billion or \$24 million each day on marketing its products 12 13 nationwide, with much of the marketing aimed at children; and 14 WHEREAS, It is imperative that visible, unified tobacco 15 cessation and prevention education efforts by community members 16 be launched to encourage all tobacco users to become tobacco-17 free; and

18 WHEREAS, Businesses, government, law enforcement, schools, faith-based institutions, service organizations, youths, 19 physicians, senior citizens, military organizations, sports 20 teams and individuals from all walks of life can demonstrate 21 their commitment to tobacco-free, healthy lifestyles by 22 23 participating in "Kick Butts Day"; therefore be it 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate March 25 21, 2018, as "Kick Butts Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage 26 27 residents of all ages to participate in tobacco cessation and 28 prevention education activities to make a visible show of 29 support for our strong commitment to a tobacco-free community, encouraging all youths and adults to pledge to be tobacco-free. 30

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
