## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2018 as "The Month of the Young Child" in Pennsylvania. 2
- WHEREAS, There are more than 730,000 children from birth to 3
- five years of age in this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, A young child's brain forms 700 neural synapses a
- second, and the circuits for key functions such as vision, 6
- 7 hearing, language and higher cognitive function develop the most
- 8 in the first five years of life; and
- WHEREAS, The creation of these circuits is affected by a
- child's early learning environment; and 10
- 11 WHEREAS, Young children learn best when they have proper
- 12 health and nutrition, a safe and stable family and home life and
- 13 activities that stimulate creativity, curiosity and the
- 14 development of all the skills they will need to succeed; and
- 15 WHEREAS, High-quality early learning and conditions for
- optimal child development play a major role in a child's future 16

- 1 success in school and in life; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Talking, reading and playing with children from
- 3 birth builds the language, mathematics and social skills they
- 4 need to be ready for kindergarten; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Forty years of research has shown that children
- 6 receiving high-quality early education are more likely to be
- 7 prepared for and do better in school, graduate from high school,
- 8 attend college and participate in job training; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Children attending high-quality early learning
- 10 programs are better prepared for the competitive work force,
- 11 including opportunities in law enforcement and the military; and
- 12 WHEREAS, High-quality early learning is especially beneficial
- 13 to children whose educational opportunities are hindered by
- 14 poverty or other circumstances; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Parents and quardians are able to be productive,
- 16 engaged and focused employees when their children are afforded a
- 17 stable and high-quality early learning environment at a
- 18 reasonable cost; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Research demonstrates high-quality early learning
- 20 saves taxpayer dollars by reducing the need for special
- 21 education and remedial instruction and decreases drop-out rates,
- 22 crime and incarceration; and
- 23 WHEREAS, High-quality early learning programs in this
- 24 Commonwealth such as Pre-K Counts, Head Start Supplemental
- 25 Assistance Program, Keystone STARS, Early Intervention and
- 26 evidence-based home visiting are sound investments that are
- 27 preparing our youngest children for success in school and in
- 28 life; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Supporting and retaining a well-trained, early
- 30 learning staff is critical since a highly qualified staff is an

- 1 essential element of a high-quality program; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The number of high-quality early learning programs
- 3 in this Commonwealth falls short of meeting the needs of
- 4 children in this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Only one in six children is able to access high-
- 6 quality, publicly funded prekindergarten, and only 4.8% of child
- 7 care openings for children birth to four years of age are in the
- 8 highest quality STAR 4 or accredited programs; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Delayed investments in early childhood education are
- 10 lost opportunities; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 12 month of April 2018 as "The Month of the Young Child" in
- 13 Pennsylvania and recognize that each child in this Commonwealth
- 14 deserves access to high-quality early learning opportunities.
