A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating April 17, 2018, as "Tuskegee Airmen Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, During World War I, African Americans were
4	prohibited from serving as military pilots in the United States
5	Armed Forces due to their race; and
6	WHEREAS, In 1939, in response to advocacy by civil rights
7	leaders and the National Association for the Advancement of
8	Colored People, the Congress of the United States approved
9	funding designated for the training of African-American military
10	pilots; and
11	WHEREAS, On March 22, 1941, the United States Army Air Corps
12	99th Pursuit Squadron was activated to become the first African-
13	American fighter squadron; and
14	WHEREAS, The members of the 99th Pursuit Squadron were the

first to be known as Tuskegee Airmen because they had received
their initial flight training at Moton Field, a segregated air
base in Tuskegee, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Other Tuskeqee Airmen would later form the famous 4 332nd Fighter Group, also known as the "Red Tails" due to the 5 distinctive red marking on the tail of their aircraft; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Between 1941 and 1946, nearly 1,000 African-American 8 military pilots were trained in Tuskeqee, Alabama; and 9 WHEREAS, During World War II, the Tuskegee Airmen flew more 10 than 15,000 sorties and lost 66 men in the line of duty, one of the lowest loss records of any escort fighter group; and 11 12 WHEREAS, The courage, dedication and service of the Tuskegee 13 Airmen continues to inspire both military personnel and 14 civilians of all backgrounds throughout this country; therefore be it 15

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April 17 17, 2018, as "Tuskegee Airmen Day" in Pennsylvania.
