INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, APRIL 24, 2018

A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating May 1, 2018, as "Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
4	Services, in 2016 United States health care spending increased
5	4.3% to reach \$3.3 trillion or \$10,348 per person; and
6	WHEREAS, The overall share of gross domestic product related
7	to health care spending was 17.9% in 2016, up from 17.7% in
8	2015; and
9	WHEREAS, Health care spending has risen more than 40% in the
10	last decade; and
11	WHEREAS, Only 5% of health care industry revenues are
12	invested in information technology and management systems,
13	versus a 10.5% revenue investment from other data-intensive
14	industries such as banking; and
15	WHEREAS, A recent study conducted by the Commonwealth Fund
16	has demonstrated that the use of automated clinical decision

support systems can result in a net reduction of \$538 per
 patient per hospital stay; and

3 WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine reports that there are at least 1.5 million preventable adverse drug events per year, each 4 adding more than \$8,700 to the cost of a hospital stay; and 5 WHEREAS, The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 6 7 reports that between 2011 and 2015 50,607 providers and 8 facilities in this Commonwealth received \$1.4 billion in Federal incentive payments to implement electronic health care records; 9 10 and

WHEREAS, Ninety-seven percent of eligible hospitals and fifty-six percent of ambulatory health care providers in this Commonwealth adopted, upgraded or demonstrated meaningful use of an electronic health care record system in 2015; and

15 WHEREAS, Health care providers in this Commonwealth report an 16 improved ability to recruit physicians coming out of medical 17 school when advanced information technology is deployed; and 18 WHEREAS, Supporters and members of the Healthcare Information 19 and Management Systems Society advocate for the following:

(1) Improved access to health care for rural
 Pennsylvanians through the expanded use of telehealth.

(2) Funding for work force development programs to help
increase the health care and information technology work
force in this Commonwealth.

(3) The adoption of policies that promote
interoperability standards which enable cooperation by all
provider communities in this Commonwealth;
