A RESOLUTION

- Designating May 4, 2018, as "Octoraro Hotel and Tavern Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Built in 1827 and located in the center of beautiful
- 4 downtown Oxford, the Octoraro Hotel and Tavern has served as a
- 5 stopping point for generations of residents and travellers; and
- 6 WHEREAS, One of the oldest taverns in this Commonwealth, the
- 7 Octoraro Hotel and Tavern received its liquor license the day
- 8 after Prohibition ended in December 1933 and became one of the
- 9 leading public houses halfway between Philadelphia and
- 10 Baltimore; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In August 2013 under the new leadership of John
- 12 McGlothlin and Brannon Seaman, the Octoraro Hotel and Tavern
- 13 began renovations, and business began booming; and
- 14 WHEREAS, On November 4, 2014, a kitchen fire gutted this
- 15 historic building, and the Octoraro Hotel and Tavern was closed
- 16 for an extended period of time; and
- 17 WHEREAS, With the support of the local community, the
- 18 Octoraro Hotel and Tavern was lovingly restored, renovated and

- 1 rebuilt; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Under the ownership of John and Nickoel McGlothlin,
- 3 the Octoraro Hotel and Tavern continues to be a cornerstone of
- 4 recent revitalization efforts of downtown Oxford; and
- 5 WHEREAS, A hallmark of the institution over the years has
- 6 been a series of large, illuminated vertical signs proudly
- 7 proclaiming "Octoraro Hotel," but in recent years, the "H" and
- 8 "L" in the word "Hotel" mysteriously disappeared from the sign,
- 9 leading locals to coin the affectionate nickname "The OTE";
- 10 therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 4,
- 12 2018, as "Octoraro Hotel and Tavern Day" in Pennsylvania.
