## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2018 as "Civic Education Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is where the constitutional
- 4 government for the United States of America began 231 years ago;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, In order to ensure that "the government of the
- 7 people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish" as so
- 8 eloquently stated by President Abraham Lincoln at Gettysburg, it
- 9 is necessary to ensure that each succeeding generation of
- 10 Americans understands the principles of American self-governance
- 11 and the ideals and principles on which our representative
- 12 democracy is based and from which its institutions derive their
- 13 legitimacy and power; and
- 14 WHEREAS, National testing shows an unfortunate ignorance
- 15 among eighth grade students about civics, geography and American
- 16 history, while at the same time national polling shows that

- 1 Americans strongly support the role of public schools in
- 2 teaching young people how to become responsible citizens; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth currently requires civic education
- 4 in the form of social studies from kindergarten through grade
- 5 12; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Act 35 of 2018, which adds a new section to the
- 7 Public School Code of 1949 regarding assessment of civic
- 8 knowledge, requires each school entity, beginning with the 2020-
- 9 2021 school year, to administer at least once to students in
- 10 grades seven through twelve a locally developed assessment of
- 11 United States history, government and civics that includes the
- 12 nature, purpose, principles and structure of United States
- 13 constitutional democracy, the principles, operations and
- 14 documents of United States Government and the rights and
- 15 responsibilities of citizenship; and
- 16 WHEREAS, American adults could also benefit from civic
- 17 education to encourage greater civic engagement and involvement
- 18 in our electoral and political process; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Civic education and participation in extracurricular
- 20 activities are indicators for future civic engagement and
- 21 involvement in our American democracy; and
- 22 WHEREAS, With high-quality civic education, students learn to
- 23 listen to differing points of view, take greater responsibility
- 24 for their own role in the government of "We the People" and work
- 25 toward improving their own communities; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 27 month of September 2018 as "Civic Education Awareness Month" in
- 28 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all
- 30 residents of this Commonwealth to celebrate efforts to educate

- 1 and inform American citizens about their rights and
- 2 responsibilities and the importance of civic engagement.
