A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and substantial accomplishments of Aretha
 2 Franklin.
- 3 WHEREAS, On March 25, 1942, Aretha Louise Franklin was born
- 4 to Barbara Siggers Franklin and C.L. Franklin who were,
- 5 respectively, a gospel singer and famous pastor; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Her father's career as a pastor led the family from
- 7 Memphis to Buffalo and then to Detroit, where his dynamic
- 8 sermons were broadcast nationwide and recorded; and
- 9 WHEREAS, When she was six years of age, Ms. Franklin's
- 10 parents separated, leaving her in her father's care; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Franklin household was always filled with music
- 12 and was situated near the houses of future Motown artists such
- 13 as Smokey Robinson and Diana Ross; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Ms. Franklin began teaching herself to play piano
- 15 before she was 10 years of age and joined her father on tour at
- 16 12 years of age, playing piano and belting gospel songs in

- 1 various churches; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The first recordings of Ms. Franklin's gospel
- 3 singing came when she was 14 years of age and soon thereafter
- 4 she shifted her career toward secular music, a decision that led
- 5 to her eventually becoming known as the "Queen of Soul"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Ms. Franklin had 88 Billboard chart hits and, during
- 7 the peak of her career, more than two dozen Top 40 hits; and
- 8 WHEREAS, She won 18 Grammy awards, including Top R&B Female
- 9 Artist for eight consecutive years; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Ms. Franklin's songs not only topped the music
- 11 charts they also became part of our cultural vernacular with
- 12 hits such as "Respect" and "Think" remembered not just for their
- 13 melodious rhythms, but also for standing as beacons of racial
- 14 and gender empowerment; and
- 15 WHEREAS, She performed at numerous noteworthy events,
- 16 including the presidential inauguration in 2009, preinauguration
- 17 concerts in 1977 and 1993 and at Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s
- 18 funeral in 1968; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Rolling Stone Magazine called Aretha Franklin "one
- 20 of the most influential and important voices in pop history"
- 21 while former President Barack Obama said that she was someone
- 22 who "helped define the American experience"; and
- WHEREAS, In 1987, Ms. Franklin's numerous accomplishments
- 24 resulted in her being the first woman admitted into the Rock and
- 25 Roll Hall of Fame; and
- 26 WHEREAS, She used her fame for more than personal benefit,
- 27 becoming one of the most charitable musical stars of her day by
- 28 supporting an expansive spectrum of causes, including raising
- 29 money to combat childhood diabetes and malnutrition, promoting
- 30 efforts toward rainforest preservation and providing resources

- 1 for at-risk youth; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Aretha Franklin suffered from advanced pancreatic
- 3 cancer and passed away at 9:50 a.m. on Thursday, August 16,
- 4 2018, surrounded by family and friends at her home in Detroit,
- 5 Michigan; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the life
- 7 and substantial accomplishments of Aretha Franklin, an
- 8 influential national icon; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives extend its
- 10 deepest condolences to the surviving family members and friends
- 11 of Aretha Franklin.
