A RESOLUTION

Designating the week of September 23 through 29, 2018, as 1 "Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative Programs Week" in 2 Pennsylvania. 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's array of public and private service 4 5 providers have continued to evolve in response to juvenile justice system reform efforts by improving the quality of 6 service delivery and simultaneously striving to ensure the 7 protection of our communities; and 8 9 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative 10 Programs, an association of Pennsylvania service providers, originally established in 1978, is celebrating 40 years as a 11 12 juvenile justice service provider association; and 13 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania service providers have adapted to

serving low-risk to moderate-risk youths within the community

and moderate-risk to high-risk youths in residential programs;

17 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania service providers offer uniquely

- 2 address the individualized needs of specific populations; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania service providers offer an array of
- 4 services, including secure detention, secure treatment,
- 5 institutional facilities, group homes, foster homes and
- 6 community-based and in-home programming; and
- WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's juvenile detention centers and
- 8 alternative programs, adhering to the Balanced and Restorative
- 9 Justice Model, contribute to public safety by providing a stable
- 10 environment for at-risk youths, providing education and
- 11 programming and ensuring sufficient opportunities for growth and
- 12 development of Pennsylvania's youths; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Juvenile detention centers and alternative programs
- 14 ensure every child's health and well-being by providing
- 15 competency development, self-discipline and stabilization
- 16 through comprehensive physical and behavioral health evaluations
- 17 as well as community involvement; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Thousands of men and women are dedicated to ensuring
- 19 the proper care and supervision of youths and are committed to
- 20 the protection of Pennsylvania's communities; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Youth care workers in Pennsylvania detention centers
- 22 and alternative programs stand ready on a daily basis to respond
- 23 to youths who display an array of unresolved mental health,
- 24 behavioral, educational and emotional issues; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative
- 26 Programs, an affiliate of the County Commissioners Association
- 27 of Pennsylvania, is an association of Pennsylvania service
- 28 providers that acts as a key resource for these service
- 29 providers offering education, representation and support for the
- 30 important services they provide; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's juvenile justice service providers in
- 2 coordination with the Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative
- 3 Programs merit one week of recognition for their unending
- 4 services aimed at protecting our communities and assisting
- 5 Pennsylvania's youths; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 7 week of September 23 through 29, 2018, as "Juvenile Detention
- 8 Centers and Alternative Programs Week" in Pennsylvania.
