AN ACT

Amending the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), 1 entitled "An act establishing salaries and compensation of 2 certain public officials including justices and judges of 3 Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas, judges of the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the Philadelphia 5 Traffic Court, district justices and the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor 7 General, the Attorney General and certain other State officers and the salary and certain expenses of the members of the General Assembly; and repealing certain inconsistent 10 acts," further providing for members of the General Assembly. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 4(d) and (d.1) of the act of September 15 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), known as the Public Official Compensation Law, are amended to read: 16 17 Section 4. Members of the General Assembly. 18 19 Subsequent annual cost-of-living adjustment for 20 members. --21 (1) For the 12-month period beginning December 1, 1997, 22 through November 30, 1998, and for each like 12-month period

- 1 thereafter, the salary of the members of the General Assembly
- 2 shall be increased by an annual cost-of-living adjustment
- 3 calculated by applying the percentage change in the Consumer
- 4 Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the
- 5 Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area, for the
- 6 most recent 12-month period for which figures have been
- officially reported by the United States Department of Labor,
- 8 Bureau of Labor Statistics immediately prior to the date the
- 9 adjustment is due to take effect, to the then current salary
- amounts. The percentage increase and the new salary amounts
- shall be determined jointly by the Chief Clerk of the Senate
- and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives prior to
- the annual effective date of the adjustment and shall be
- 14 published by them in the Pennsylvania Bulletin within ten
- days of the date such determination is made.
- 16 (2) A member of the General Assembly may elect to reject
- 17 <u>receipt of the annual cost-of-living adjustment under this</u>
- 18 subsection if the member notifies in writing the Chief Clerk
- of the Senate or the Chief Clerk of the House of
- 20 Representatives, as applicable, no later than ten days prior
- 21 to the annual effective date of the adjustment. An election
- by a member of the General Assembly to reject receipt of the
- adjustment shall be irrevocable during the member's term of
- 24 office.
- 25 (d.1) Subsequent annual cost-of-living adjustment for
- 26 officers and leaders.--
- 27 (1) For the 12-month period beginning December 1, 1997,
- through November 30, 1998, and for each like 12-month period
- 29 thereafter, the additional compensation of the officers and
- 30 leaders of the General Assembly shall be increased by an

1 annual cost-of-living adjustment calculated by applying the 2 percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban 3 Consumers (CPI-U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware 4 and Maryland area, for the most recent 12-month period for 5 which figures have been officially reported by the United 6 States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics 7 immediately prior to the date the adjustment is due to take 8 effect, to the then current compensation. The percentage 9 increase and the new compensation amounts shall be determined 10 jointly by the Chief Clerk of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives prior to the annual effective 11 12 date of the adjustment and shall be published in the 13 Pennsylvania Bulletin within 20 days immediately prior to 14 each cost-of-living increase taking effect.

(2) An officer or leader of the General Assembly may elect to reject receipt of the annual cost-of-living adjustment under this subsection if the officer or leader notifies in writing the Chief Clerk of the Senate or the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, as applicable, no later than ten days prior to the annual effective date of the adjustment. An election by an officer or leader of the General Assembly to reject receipt of the adjustment shall be irrevocable during the officer's or leader's term of office as a member of the General Assembly.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
