## AN ACT

19	Section 1. Section 202 of the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd

22	Section 202. Personnel and Employment Offices <u>(a)</u> The
23	secretary shall have power to establish such offices and to

(b) The department is authorized to cooperate with or to 6 7 enter into agreements with the Railroad Retirement Board or any 8 other agency of the United States charged with the administration of an unemployment compensation law, with any 9 10 political subdivision of this State, or with any private nonprofit organization, with respect to the establishment, 11 12 maintenance, and use of free employment service facilities and 13 free public employment offices, and, as a part of any such 14 agreement, may accept moneys, services, or quarters as a contribution to the administration fund. 15

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
