AN ACT

Amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the 1 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for drug and alcohol recovery houses and establishing the Drug and Alcohol-Recovery House Fund. AMENDING THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177, NO.175), ENTITLED, AS AMENDED, "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AND REORGANIZING THE 6 CONDUCT OF THE EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE WORK OF THE 7 COMMONWEALTH BY THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT THEREOF AND THE 9 ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, AND OFFICERS THEREOF, INCLUDING THE BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF STATE NORMAL 10 SCHOOLS, OR TEACHERS COLLEGES; ABOLISHING, CREATING, 11 REORGANIZING OR AUTHORIZING THE REORGANIZATION OF CERTAIN 12 ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS, AND COMMISSIONS; DEFINING 13 THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE GOVERNOR AND OTHER EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS, AND OF THE SEVERAL ADMINISTRATIVE 15 DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, AND OFFICERS; FIXING THE 16 SALARIES OF THE GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, AND CERTAIN 17 OTHER EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS; PROVIDING FOR 18 THE APPOINTMENT OF CERTAIN ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS, AND OF 19 ALL DEPUTIES AND OTHER ASSISTANTS AND EMPLOYES IN CERTAIN 20 DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS, AND COMMISSIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE 21 REGULATION OF PARI-MUTUEL THOROUGHBRED HORSE RACING AND 22 HARNESS HORSE RACING ACTIVITIES, IMPOSING CERTAIN TAXES AND 23 PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF FUNDS FROM PARI-MUTUEL 24 25 TICKETS; AND PRESCRIBING THE MANNER IN WHICH THE NUMBER AND COMPENSATION OF THE DEPUTIES AND ALL OTHER ASSISTANTS AND 26 27 EMPLOYES OF CERTAIN DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS SHALL BE DETERMINED, " IN POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF 28 DRUG AND ALCOHOL PROGRAMS, PROVIDING FOR DRUG AND ALCOHOL 29 RECOVERY HOUSES AND ESTABLISHING THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL 30 RECOVERY HOUSE FUND; AND MAKING EDITORIAL CHANGES. 31

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 1 2 hereby enacts as follows: 3 Section 1. Definitions. 19 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 20 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 21 22 "Department." The Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs of 23 the Commonwealth. 24 "Drug and alcohol recovery house." Housing for individuals 25 recovering from drug or alcohol addiction, which provides those 26 individuals with a safe and supportive drug and alcohol free 27 environment, peer support and other recovery support services 28 that may include coordination of treatment services. § 5702. Powers and duties of department. 29 30 The department shall license or certify drug and alcohol-

1	recovery houses directly or through a contracted entity, as
2	defined by department guidelines, which shall adhere to National
3	Alliance for Recovery Residences standards with modifications
4	deemed necessary by the department. All referrals from State
5	agencies or State-funded facilities shall be to licensed or
6	certified drug and alcohol recovery houses, and only licensed or
7	certified recovery houses may be eligible to receive Federal or
8	State funding to deliver drug and alcohol recovery housing
9	services.
_0	§ 5703. Regulations for licensure or certification of drug and
1	alcohol recovery houses.
2	(a) Regulations. The department may promulgate regulations
_3	for the licensure or certification of drug and alcohol recovery
4	houses to ensure that the drug and alcohol recovery houses
. 5	provide a safe environment for residents. The regulations may
6	include, but not be limited to, the following:
_7	(1) Upon admission, ensuring that residents are informed
8 .	of all drug and alcohol recovery house rules, residency
_9	requirements and lease agreements.
20	(2) Policies and procedures for management of all funds
21	received and expended by the drug and alcohol recovery house
22	in accordance with standard accounting practices, including
23	funds received from or managed on behalf of residents of the
24	house.
25	(3) Policies and procedures addressing the safety and
26	protection of residents.
27	(4) Policies that promote recovery by requiring resident
28	participation in treatment, self-help groups or other
29	recovery supports.
30	(5) Policies requiring abstinence from alcohol and other

1	illicit drugs.
2	(6) Procedures regarding appropriate use and security of
3	medication.
4	(7) The maintenance of the property in which the drug
5	and alcohol recovery house is located, including, but not
6	limited to, the installation of functioning smoke detectors,
7	carbon monoxide detectors and fire extinguishers.
8	(b) Temporary regulations. In order to facilitate the
9	prompt implementation of this chapter, regulations promulgated
10	by the department shall be deemed temporary regulations that
11	shall not expire for a period of three years following
12	publication. Temporary regulations shall not be subject to:
13	(1) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of
14	July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
15	Commonwealth Documents Law.
16	(2) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October
17	15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth
18	Attorneys Act.
19	(3) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
20	the Regulatory Review Act.
21	(c) Expiration of authority. The authority of the
22	department to promulgate temporary regulations under subsection
23	(b) shall expire three years after the effective date of this
24	section. Regulations adopted after this period shall be
25	promulgated as provided by law.
26	§ 5704. Funding.
27	A drug and alcohol recovery house or other recovery house
28	shall not be authorized to provide services or receive funding
29	from the department or any Federal, State or county agency
30	without licensure or certification.

- 1 § 5705. Licensure or certification.
- 2 (a) Time period. Licensure or certification shall last for
- 3 a period of two years.
- 4 (b) Compliance of existing drug and alcohol recovery
- 5 houses. A drug and alcohol recovery house in existence on the
- 6 <u>effective date of this section may be deemed licensed or</u>
- 7 <u>certified by the department after inspection and if the drug and</u>
- 8 <u>alcohol recovery house provides documentation to the department</u>
- 9 <u>within 180 days after the promulgation of regulations by the</u>
- 10 department that it is in compliance with the regulations.
- 11 (c) Fee. The department shall establish a fee to be paid by
- 12 <u>each drug and alcohol recovery house adequate to carry out the</u>
- 13 provisions of this chapter.
- 14 <u>§ 5706. Registry.</u>
- 15 The department shall create and maintain a publicly
- 16 <u>accessible registry on its publicly accessible Internet website</u>
- 17 of all licensed or certified drug and alcohol recovery houses
- 18 within this Commonwealth, which shall be updated annually by the
- 19 <u>department</u>.
- 20 § 5707. Violations.
- 21 A person owning a drug and alcohol recovery house that has
- 22 failed to attain or maintain licensure or certification of a
- 23 drug and alcohol recovery house and has not been licensed or
- 24 <u>certified by the department shall pay a fine of \$1,000 for each</u>
- 25 violation.
- 26 § 5708. Restricted account.
- 27 <u>All fines and fees collected shall be deposited into a</u>
- 28 restricted account in the department which is established and
- 29 <u>shall be known as the Drug and Alcohol Recovery House Fund.</u>
- 30 Money in this account is to be utilized for the enforcement of

- 1 this chapter.
- 2 § 5709. Compliance with other laws.
- 3 In order to receive and maintain licensure or certification,
- 4 <u>all drug and alcohol recovery houses must be in compliance with</u>
- 5 all Federal, State and local ordinances. Failure to comply or
- 6 remain in compliance shall result in loss of licensure or
- 7 <u>certification and removal from the registry.</u>
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 120 days.

- 27 SECTION 2312-A. POWERS AND DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT.
- THE DEPARTMENT SHALL LICENSE OR CERTIFY DRUG AND ALCOHOL
- 29 RECOVERY HOUSES DIRECTLY OR THROUGH A CONTRACTED ENTITY, AS
- 30 <u>DEFINED BY DEPARTMENT GUIDELINES, WHICH SHALL ADHERE TO NATIONAL</u>

- 1 ALLIANCE FOR RECOVERY RESIDENCES STANDARDS WITH MODIFICATIONS
- 2 DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE DEPARTMENT. ALL REFERRALS FROM STATE
- 3 AGENCIES OR STATE-FUNDED FACILITIES SHALL BE TO LICENSED OR
- 4 CERTIFIED DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSES, AND ONLY LICENSED OR
- 5 CERTIFIED RECOVERY HOUSES MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE FEDERAL OR
- 6 STATE FUNDING TO DELIVER DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSING

- 8 SECTION 2313-A. REGULATIONS FOR LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION OF
- 9 DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSES.
- 10 (A) REGULATIONS.--THE DEPARTMENT MAY PROMULGATE REGULATIONS
- 11 FOR THE LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION OF DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY
- 12 HOUSES THAT RECEIVE FUNDS OR REFERRALS FROM THE DEPARTMENT, OR A
- 13 FEDERAL, STATE OR OTHER COUNTY AGENCY, TO ENSURE THAT THE DRUG
- 14 AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSES PROVIDE A SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR
- 15 RESIDENTS. THE REGULATIONS MAY INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO,
- 16 THE FOLLOWING:
- 17 (1) UPON ADMISSION, ENSURING THAT RESIDENTS ARE INFORMED
- 18 OF ALL DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE RULES, RESIDENCY
- 19 REQUIREMENTS AND LEASE AGREEMENTS.
- 20 (2) POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR MANAGEMENT OF ALL FUNDS
- 21 RECEIVED AND EXPENDED BY THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE
- 22 IN ACCORDANCE WITH STANDARD ACCOUNTING PRACTICES, INCLUDING
- 23 FUNDS RECEIVED FROM OR MANAGED ON BEHALF OF RESIDENTS OF THE
- 24 HOUSE. AS USED IN THIS PARAGRAPH, THE TERM "FUNDS" DOES NOT
- 25 INCLUDE PUBLIC ASSISTANCE BENEFITS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT
- 26 LIMITED TO, MEDICAL ASSISTANCE, CASH ASSISTANCE AND FOOD
- 27 STAMPS.
- 28 (3) POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ADDRESSING THE SAFETY AND
- 29 PROTECTION OF RESIDENTS.
- 30 (4) POLICIES THAT PROMOTE RECOVERY BY REQUIRING RESIDENT

- 1 PARTICIPATION IN TREATMENT, SELF-HELP GROUPS OR OTHER
- 2 RECOVERY SUPPORTS.
- 3 (5) POLICIES REOUIRING ABSTINENCE FROM ALCOHOL AND OTHER
- 4 ILLICIT DRUGS.
- 5 (6) PROCEDURES REGARDING APPROPRIATE USE AND SECURITY OF
- 6 <u>MEDICATION</u>.
- 7 (7) THE MAINTENANCE OF THE PROPERTY IN WHICH THE DRUG
- 8 AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE IS LOCATED, INCLUDING, BUT NOT
- 9 <u>LIMITED TO, THE INSTALLATION OF FUNCTIONING SMOKE DETECTORS,</u>
- 10 CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS AND FIRE EXTINGUISHERS.
- 11 (8) POLICIES AND PROCEDURES WHICH PROHIBIT AN OWNER,
- 12 HOUSE ADMINISTRATOR OR EMPLOYEE OF A DRUG AND ALCOHOL
- 13 RECOVERY HOUSE FROM REQUIRING A RESIDENT TO SIGN ANY DOCUMENT
- 14 FOR THE PURPOSE OF RELINQUISHING THE RESIDENT'S PUBLIC
- ASSISTANCE BENEFITS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, MEDICAL
- 16 ASSISTANCE, CASH ASSISTANCE AND FOOD STAMPS.
- 17 (B) TEMPORARY REGULATIONS.--IN ORDER TO FACILITATE THE
- 18 PROMPT IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS CHAPTER, REGULATIONS PROMULGATED
- 19 BY THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE DEEMED TEMPORARY REGULATIONS THAT
- 20 SHALL NOT EXPIRE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS FOLLOWING

- 30 (C) EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.--THE AUTHORITY OF THE

- 1 DEPARTMENT TO PROMULGATE TEMPORARY REGULATIONS UNDER SUBSECTION
- 2 (B) SHALL EXPIRE THREE YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
- 3 SECTION. REGULATIONS ADOPTED AFTER THIS PERIOD SHALL BE
- 4 PROMULGATED AS PROVIDED BY LAW.
- 5 SECTION 2314-A. FUNDING.
- A DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE OR OTHER RECOVERY HOUSE
- 7 SHALL NOT BE AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE SERVICES OR RECEIVE FUNDING
- 8 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OR ANY FEDERAL, STATE OR COUNTY AGENCY
- 9 <u>WITHOUT LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION.</u>
- 10 SECTION 2315-A. LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION.
- 11 (A) TIME PERIOD.--LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION SHALL LAST FOR
- 12 A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.
- 13 (B) COMPLIANCE OF EXISTING DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY
- 14 HOUSES.--A DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE IN EXISTENCE ON THE
- 15 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION MAY BE DEEMED LICENSED OR
- 16 CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT AFTER INSPECTION AND IF THE DRUG AND
- 17 ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE PROVIDES DOCUMENTATION TO THE DEPARTMENT
- 18 WITHIN 180 DAYS AFTER THE PROMULGATION OF REGULATIONS BY THE

- THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE AND MAINTAIN A PUBLICLY
- 26 ACCESSIBLE REGISTRY ON ITS PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE
- 27 OF ALL LICENSED OR CERTIFIED DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSES
- 28 <u>WITHIN THIS COMMONWEALTH, WHICH SHALL BE UPDATED ANNUALLY BY THE</u>
- 29 DEPARTMENT.
- 30 <u>SECTION 2317-A. VIOLATIONS.</u>

- 1 (A) PENALTIES. -- A PERSON OWNING A DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY
- 2 HOUSE THAT IS FUNDED, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, WITH FUNDING FROM THE
- 3 DEPARTMENT, OR A FEDERAL, OTHER STATE OR COUNTY AGENCY, THAT HAS
- 4 FAILED TO ATTAIN OR MAINTAIN LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION OF A
- 5 DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE AND HAS NOT BEEN LICENSED OR
- 6 CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PAY A FINE OF \$1,000 FOR EACH
- 7 VIOLATION.
- 8 (B) REFERRAL.--IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES A DRUG AND
- 9 <u>ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE IS NOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ARTICLE</u>
- 10 DUE TO AN ALLEGED VIOLATION OF ANY FEDERAL, STATE OR LOCAL LAW,
- 11 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REFER THE MATTER TO THE APPROPRIATE AGENCY
- 12 FOR INVESTIGATION.
- 13 <u>SECTION 2318-A.</u> <u>RESTRICTED ACCOUNT.</u>
- 14 <u>ALL FINES AND FEES COLLECTED SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO A</u>
- 15 RESTRICTED ACCOUNT IN THE DEPARTMENT WHICH IS ESTABLISHED AND
- 16 SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSE FUND.
- 17 MONEY IN THIS ACCOUNT IS TO BE UTILIZED FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF
- 18 THIS SUBARTICLE.
- 19 SECTION 2319-A. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.
- 20 IN ORDER TO RECEIVE AND MAINTAIN LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION,
- 21 ALL DRUG AND ALCOHOL RECOVERY HOUSES MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH
- 22 ALL FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL ORDINANCES. FAILURE TO COMPLY OR
- 23 REMAIN IN COMPLIANCE SHALL RESULT IN LOSS OF LICENSURE OR
- 24 CERTIFICATION AND REMOVAL FROM THE REGISTRY.
- 25 SECTION 3. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 120 DAYS.
