8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
11	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections
12	to read:
13	Section 1528. Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation. (a) The State <
14	Board of Education and the Department of Education shall work in
15	consultation with the American Heart Association and American
16	Red Cross to further develop the existing academic standards for
17	cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction for students in grades
18	nine through 12. The Department of Education shall:
19	(i) Further develop the existing academic standards for

1	cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction no later than twenty-
2	four (24) months after the effective date of this section.
3	(ii) Provide the enhanced academic standards and other
4	materials developed to a nonpublic school within this
5	Commonwealth upon receiving request from the nonpublic school.
6	(b) The academic standards shall be amended to include the
7	following:
8	(i) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation shall be defined as "a
9	first aid technique utilizing hands-only compressions of the
10	chest used to revive a person whose heart has stopped beating."
11	(ii) The following phrases shall be added and defined:
12	(A) Assessment of cardiac arrest.
13	(B) Psychomotor skills.
14	(C) Application of hands only cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
15	Section 1529. Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation in Schools. (a)
16	School instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation as under
17	academic standards and under section 1528 shall include the
18	following:
19	(i) An instructional program developed by the American Heart
20	Association, the American Red Cross or another program that is
21	nationally recognized and is based on the most current American
22	Heart Association or American Red Cross guidelines for
23	cardiopulmonary resuscitation and emergency cardiovascular care.
24	(ii) The psychomotor skills necessary to perform
25	cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
26	(iii) Information on the purpose of an automated external
27	<u>defibrillator.</u>
28	(b) The instruction may be integrated into an appropriate
29	course of study. A teacher, instructor or community volunteer
30	may provide, facilitate or oversee the instruction and is not

3	(c) If a pupil is unable to perform the psychomotor skill
4	component of the instruction, or upon written request of the
5	pupil's parent or guardian, a pupil shall be excused from taking
6	the instruction under this section.
7	(d) Employes who complete continuing professional education
8	<u>under section 1205.4 in regards to cardiopulmonary resuscitation</u>
9	and first aid training shall receive credit under section 1205.2
10	if the training has been approved by the Department of
11	Education.
12	(e) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
13	shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
14	the context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Psychomotor skills." The use of hands on practice to
16	support cognitive learning.
17	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
18	SECTION 1528. CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION EDUCATION(A) <
19	IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACADEMIC STANDARDS FOR HEALTH, SAFETY AND
20	PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOR GRADES NINE THROUGH TWELVE AND NOT LATER
21	THAN THE BEGINNING OF THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT,
22	IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND AT LEAST ONE
23	ORGANIZATION RECOGNIZED UNDER SECTION 1205.4, SHALL DEVELOP A
24	MODEL CURRICULUM AND CURRICULUM GUIDELINES FOR INSTRUCTION ON
25	CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN

27	(B) THE MODEL CURRICULUM AND GUIDELINES SHALL:

1 (3) BE REVISED REGULARLY TO REMAIN CURRENT WITH NATIONAL 2 STANDARDS; 3 (4) PROVIDE GUIDANCE FOR INTEGRATION INTO HEALTH COURSES OR 4 OTHER APPROPRIATE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENT AS LISTED IN 22 PA. 5 CODE § 4.23 (RELATING TO HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION); 6 (5) BE MADE AVAILABLE TO ALL SCHOOL ENTITIES; 7 (6) INCLUDE COMPILATION OF RECOMMENDED GUIDELINES AND 8 EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS FROM ORGANIZATIONS WITH EXPERTISE IN CPR 9 AND EMERGENCY CARE; 10 (7) INCORPORATE PSYCHOMOTOR SKILLS TRAINING, INCLUDING 11 HANDS-ONLY CPR TECHNIQUE; AND 12 (8) INCLUDE INFORMATION ON THE PURPOSE OF AN AUTOMATED 13 EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR. 14 (C) (1) A SCHOOL ENTITY THAT OFFERS INSTRUCTION IN CPR MAY 15 UTILIZE THE MODEL CURRICULUM DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER 16 SUBSECTION (A) OR DEVELOP THE SCHOOL ENTITY'S OWN CURRICULUM IN 17 ACCORDANCE WITH ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CONSISTENT WITH 18 GUIDELINES DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (A). A SCHOOL ENTITY MAY 19 UTILIZE APPROPRIATE PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY AVAILABLE MATERIALS, 20 PERSONNEL AND OTHER RESOURCES IN DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING 21 THIS INSTRUCTION, SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 111 AND 23 PA.C.S. § 6344 (RELATING TO EMPLOYEES HAVING CONTACT WITH 2.2 23 CHILDREN; ADOPTIVE AND FOSTER PARENTS). 24 (2) A TEACHER, INSTRUCTOR OR COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER MAY 25 PROVIDE, FACILITATE OR OVERSEE THE INSTRUCTION OFFERED BY A 26 SCHOOL ENTITY UNDER THIS SECTION AND NEED NOT BE A CERTIFIED CPR 27 TRAINER. 28 (D) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IN GOOD FAITH PROVIDES INSTRUCTION IN 29 CPR TO A STUDENT UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY CIVIL DAMAGES AS A RESULT OF ANY ACT OR OMISSION RELATING TO THE 30

12	TECHNIQUE UTILIZING HANDS-ONLY COMPRESSIONS OF THE CHEST USED TO
13	REVIVE AN INDIVIDUAL WHOSE HEART HAS STOPPED BEATING.
14	"DEPARTMENT." THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION OF THE
15	COMMONWEALTH.
16	"PSYCHOMOTOR SKILLS." THE USE OF HANDS-ON PRACTICE TO
17	SUPPORT COGNITIVE LEARNING.
18	"SCHOOL ENTITY." A SCHOOL DISTRICT, JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT,
19	CHARTER SCHOOL, REGIONAL CHARTER SCHOOL, CYBER CHARTER SCHOOL,
20	INTERMEDIATE UNIT OR AREA VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL SCHOOL.
21	SECTION 2. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60 DAYS.
