Amending the act of November 6, 1987 (P.L.381, No.79), entitled "An act relating to the protection of the abused, neglected, 2 exploited or abandoned elderly; establishing a uniform 3 Statewide reporting and investigative system for suspected 4 abuse, neglect, exploitation or abandonment of the elderly; 5 providing protective services; providing for funding; and making repeals," in administration, further providing for 7 duties of department and area agencies on aging. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 301(a) of the act of November 6, 1987 11 12 (P.L.381, No.79), known as the Older Adults Protective Services Act, is amended and the section is amended by adding subsections 13 14 to read: 15 Section 301. Duties of department and area agencies on aging. 16 Public information and interdepartmental consultation .--The department shall conduct an ongoing campaign designed to 17 18 inform and educate older adults, professionals and the general 19 public about the need for an availability of protective services 20 under this chapter[.], including an individuals rights,

responsibilities and choice of managed care organizations to

- 1 <u>cover long-term care services and supports.</u> The department shall
- 2 consult with other departments of the Commonwealth on the design
- 3 and implementation of the ongoing public awareness campaign. The
- 4 department shall also consider the concerns of area agencies on
- 5 aging and the entities identified by them under subsection (c).
- 6 Educational materials shall include:
- 7 (1) A description of the LIFE program.
- 8 (2) A statement that an eligible individual has the
- 9 option to enroll in the LIFE program or a managed care
- 10 organization under the Community Health Choices Program.
- 11 (3) Contact information for LIFE providers.
- 12 (a.1) Department training. -- The department shall continue to
- 13 provide training to the Independent Enrollment Broker on the
- 14 LIFE program through the Independent Enrollment Broker LIFE
- 15 module to better educate the Independent Enrollment Broker.
- 16 <u>(a.2)</u> Report.--At the end of each quarter, the department
- 17 shall issue a report that tracks by county, the enrollment of
- 18 eliqible individuals in long-term care service programs,
- 19 including a managed care organization or a LIFE program. This
- 20 report shall be published on the department's publicly
- 21 accessible Internet website.
- 22 * * *
- 23 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 24 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 25 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 26 "Eliqible individual." An individual, 55 years of age or
- 27 <u>older, who is a resident of this Commonwealth and who requires</u>
- 28 or is likely to require long-term services or supports in order
- 29 to remain living in the community and not in a nursing facility.
- 30 "Independent Enrollment Broker." A contracted Statewide

- 1 entity to facilitate the eligibility and enrollment process for
- 2 applicants seeking home and community-based services. The broker
- 3 shall work with service coordination providers to respond to
- 4 <u>participants' needs.</u>
- 5 "LIFE program." A program that is a managed care program
- 6 that provides all-inclusive care for elderly individuals in this
- 7 Commonwealth as established in accordance with 42 CFR Pt. 460
- 8 <u>(relating to programs of all-inclusive care for the elderly</u>
- 9 (PACE)).
- 10 "LIFE provider." An entity that has entered into a contract
- 11 with the department to operate a LIFE program in a specific
- 12 <u>county or set of counties.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
