AN ACT

Amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), entitled "An act providing for prescription drug monitoring; creating the ABC-MAP Board; establishing the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program; and providing for unlawful acts and penalties," further providing for requirements for prescribers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Section 8(a.1) of the act of October 27, 2014
(P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by

Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, added
November 2, 2016 (P.L. 980 , No.124), is amended to read:
Section 8. Requirements for prescribers.

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(a.1) Query not required.--
(1) [If] NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (A), IF a patient <-has been admitted to a licensed health care facility or is in observation status in a licensed health care facility, the prescriber does not need to query the system after [the] $\underline{A N}$ <--
initial query [under subsection (a) (1)] as long as the <--
patient remains admitted to the licensed health care facility or remains in observation status in a licensed health care facility.
(2) If a patient has been IS prescribed a nonnarcotic <-Schedule V controlled substance, as defined in the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, that treats an <-OF FOR THE TREATMENT OF EPILEPSY OR A seizure <-disorder, the prescriber does not need to query the system under subsection (a) (1).


Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
