AN ACT

Amending the act of June 28, 1935 (P.L.477, No.193), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the payment of the salary, 2 medical and hospital expenses of certain employes of State 3 and local government who are injured or contract certain diseases in the performance of their duty; and providing that absence during such injury shall not reduce any usual sick leave period," further providing for payment of salary, medical and hospital expenses of certain employees of State 8 and local government. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. Section 1(b) of the act of June 28, 1935 (P.L.477, No.193), referred to as the Enforcement Officer 13 Disability Benefits Law, is amended by adding a paragraph to 14 15 read: 16 Section 1. * * * 17 (b) In the case of: * * * 18 19 (13) corrections officers employed by a local government; 20 who have served for four consecutive years or longer, diseases 21 of the heart and tuberculosis of the respiratory system,

- 1 contracted or incurred by any of them after four years of
- 2 continuous service as such, and caused by extreme overexertion
- 3 in times of stress or danger or by exposure to heat, smoke,
- 4 fumes or gases, arising directly out of the employment shall be
- 5 compensable in accordance with the terms hereof; and unless any
- 6 such disability shall be compensable under the compensation laws
- 7 as having been caused by accidental injury, such disability
- 8 shall be compensable as occupational disease disabilities are
- 9 presently compensable under the compensation laws of this
- 10 Commonwealth. It shall be presumed that tuberculosis of the
- 11 respiratory system contracted or incurred after four consecutive
- 12 years of service was contracted or incurred as a direct result
- 13 of employment.
